


- 1. In accordance with the provisions of Section 29.44 of Chapter 28 of the Code of Iowa of 1946, there is submitted herewith Biennial Report of the Adjutant General's Department during the period 1 July 1944 to 30 June 1946.
- 2. A detailed report of the transactions of the Iowa State Guard prepared by Colonel Arthur T. Wallace, Chief of Staff, Iowa State Guard, is contained in this report.
- 3. Mr. Charles E. Roberts, Director, Graves Registration Service, has submitted a report concerning the activities of that department during the period covered by this Biennial Report.
- 4. This report also contains General Orders, Financial Reports, and other activities pertaining to the Iowa State Guard.
- 5. A short summary concerning the reorganization of the Iowa National Guard including the proposed allocation of units to the State of Iowa is included in this report.
- 6. To you, Governor, I extend the thanks of the entire Iowa National Guard and the Iowa State Guard for your sincere understanding of the problems which confront us and your hearty support and co-operation in matters pertaining to this department. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable circumstances.

SUBJECT: Biennial Report-Iowa State Guard.

TO: Brigadier General Charles H. Grahl, The Adjutant General of Iowa, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.

- 1. In compliance with directions, contained in your letter of August 1946, that a report of the administration and operations of the Iowa State Guard, for the period commencing 1 July 1944 and ending 30 June 1946, be furnished you, the following is respectfully submitted.
- 2. The Iowa State Guard was organized during the month of December 1941, under authority contained in Senate File 306 49th General Assembly of Iowa to provide military protection for the State of Iowa during the period of time that the Iowa National Guard was in Federal Service. It has been in continuous existence since that date.
- 3. The authorized strength of the Iowa State Guard, on 30 June 1946, was 192 officers and 2108 enlisted men. The actual strength of this organization on the same date was 192 officers and 1650 enlisted men. The Iowa State Guard, during the period this report covers, consisted of a Headquarters, Headquarters Detachment, and two regiments of infantry, a more particular description of which is contained in Appendix No. 1 of this report.
- 4. The name, rank, and branch of service of each of the commissioned personnel of the Iowa State Guard is set out in Appendix No. 2 of this report.
- 5. The Iowa State Guard is under the Command of Lieutenant General Mathew A. Tinley of Council Bluffs, Iowa. The First Regiment is commanded by Colonel Erwin H. Falk of Davenport, Iowa and the Second Regiment by Colonel Otto I. Ronningen of Ames, Iowa.
- 6. The training year of the Iowa State Guard is divided in the Armory Training Period and the Field Training Period. The Armory Training Period covers 50 weeks of the calendar year with 100 hours of training prescribed. The Field Training Period of each regiment is of two weeks duration with 74 hours of training prescribed.
 - 7. The Armory Training is that type of training which can

be most efficiently carried on in the several armories, located at the home stations of each of the units of the Iowa State Guard. In a general way, it consists of training in the school of the soldier, discipline, use and care of arms, material and equipment, close order drill, riot duty, traffic control, leadership, responsibility of commanding officers, defense against chemicals and marksmanship. The armory training is accomplished by following programs and schedules prepared by the G-3 Section of the Iowa State Guard.

- 8. The Field Training Period of the Iowa State Guard is of four weeks duration. This training is conducted by regiments, at Camp Dodge, Iowa, with each regiment so engaged for a period of two weeks. This training consists of the application of practical exercises in the field of such theoretical and practical knowledge as has been gained during the Armory Training Period. The Field Training of the Iowa State Guard in 1944 was held at Camp Dodge, Iowa from 9 July 1944 to 5 August 1944. The Second Regiment was so engaged from 9 July 1944 to 22 July 1944. The First Regiment from 23 July 1944 to 5 August 1944. The attendance at the 1944 period of Field Training was 153 officers and 1356 enlisted men. The Field Training Period of the Iowa State Guard for the year 1945 was likewise held at Camp Dodge, Iowa from 8 July 1945 to 4 August 1945. The Second Regiment was so engaged from 8 July 1945 to 21 July 1945. The First Regiment from 22 July 1945 to 4 August 1945. The attendance at the 1945 period was 159 officers and 1324 enlisted men. Officers assigned to the Headquarters Staff of the Iowa State Guard were engaged in Field Training during the 1944 period for a period of seven days and were likewise engaged in 1945 for the same length of time.
- 9. Training Inspections are made at frequent intervals, by officers of the G-3 (Plans and Training) section of the Iowa State Guard to observe the progress being made and to determine whether or not the prescribed programs and schedules are being appropriately carried out. In addition to the inspections made by officers of the Iowa State Guard, an annual inspection of each unit is made by officers of the United States Army from the Headquarters of the Seventh Service Command and the 5th Army. Training inspections made by officers of the Iowa State Guard during the year 1945 and 1946 are as follows:

Inspections made by the officers of the United States Army numbered 37 in the year 1945 and 37 in the year 1946. These inspections have been most thorough in order that the Iowa State Guard be kept at a high degree of efficiency and to insure that each unit be prepared at all times for use by the

State for any emergency, beyond the ability of civil authorities to cope with.

- 10. Units of the Iowa State Guard have been called to active duty, during the period covered by this report on nine different occasions. These missions were all in aid of civil authorities, a detailed account of which is more particularly shown in Appendix No. 3 of this report. Mention should be made of the mission performed by units of the Iowa State Guard at the State Training School for Boys at Eldora, Iowa. This mission covered a period of ninety-two days which is the longest continuous mission ever performed by any military force of the State of Iowa. The use of troops was occasioned on 31 August 1945 because of the riotous conduct of the inmates of the institution, which had created a situation beyond the ability of civil authorities to control. The use of troops at this institution was necessary for a period of 92 days. Seventeen units and 1 Detachment of the Iowa State Guard, consisting of 55 officers and 569 enlisted men, were used at various intervals during this mission. This mission was performed efficiently and reflects much credit upon the officers and men assigned to this duty.
- 11. The administration of the Iowa State Guard is carried on from the Headquarters of this organization, which are located in the office of the Adjutant General at the State Capitol in Des Moines, Iowa. The Chief of Staff, G-1, Personnel and the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 Plans and Training, are on active duty status at this station. In addition to the three commissioned officers from one to three enlisted men have been on active duty in the same connection.
- 12. The commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Iowa State Guard has changed appreciably. This condition has existed, not only during the period covered by this report, but since the organization of the Iowa State Guard. This has been due largely to the entry of many of the members of this organization into the Armed Forces. Since January 1942, it is a fair estimate to report that more than 2500 members of the enlisted personnel of this State Guard and more than 250 of the commissioned personnel entered the Armed Forces of the United States. It is also interesting to report that since the organization of the Iowa State Guard more than 8000 men have been numbered within its membership. This latter number being approximately 350 percent of its authorized strength. The appointment and promotion of the commissioned officers of the Iowa State Guard, as well as separations and transfers of commissioned officers from this organization during this biennium, is set out in Appendix No. 4 of this report.

13. The expenditures of State funds necessary for the administration, equipment and maintenance of the Iowa State Guard for the period of time commencing 1 July 1944 and ending 30 June 1945 and for the period of time commencing 1

July 1945 and ending 30 June 1946 are itemized in Appendix No. 5 of this report.

- 14. All general orders published by Headquarters, Iowa State Guard during the period covered by this report, are attached in chronological order to this report and by this reference made a part thereof.
- 15. In keeping with the established policy of the Iowa State Guard that this organization shall at all times be kept at a high state of efficiency, the system of holding through schools in each Regiment for Battalion officers has been continued. These schools are of one day duration and are held at some convenient p'ace, selected by the Battalion Commander within the Battalion area. The value of these schools as a training medium has been proven, and in the best interests of the Iowa State Guard should be continued. During the period of this report, each of the six battalions of the Iowa State Guard has held three such schools each year.
- 16. During the period of this report, two officers conferences have been held in Des Moines, Iowa. One conference consisted of all of the commissioned officers of the First Regiment and the other consisted of all of the officers of the Second Regiment. These conferences were exceedingly well attended and did much to enhance the commissioned personnel of this organization.
- 17. It is considered appropriate to mention in this report that in all of the active duty missions performed by units of the Iowa State Guard, the service rendered was of incalcuable value to the people of the State of Iowa. Each mission was performed promptly and efficiently. Reports which have reached this Headquarters relative to the conduct and performance of the troops have been both gratifying and commendatory. Both lives and property have been saved. Order has been brought out of chaos. These accomplishments speak well for all of the officers and men who participated in their performance and the fact that these men as well as all others who are and have been members of the Iowa State Guard have rendered service to their State impelled to so do by patriotic motives must necessarily react to their everlasting credit.
- 18. In concluding this report reference should be made to the fine cooperation which the Iowa State Guard has received from members of the Armed Forces of the United States stationed in this area, particularly those connected with Headquarters, Seventh Service Command, Omaha, Nebraska and the 5th Army, Chicago, Illinois. This cooperation has been most generous and helpful. It is, likewise, appropriate that this report be not concluded without a word of appreciation to Brigadier General Grahl who as The Adjutant General of Iowa has had the overall supervision of the Iowa State Guard

in addition to his other duties as Selective Service Director of the State of Iowa, and who through his intelligent and capable understanding of State Guard problems has been of inestimable assistance in making the Iowa State Guard an efficient State military force. His sympathetic and wise decisions have helped solve many complex and irksome problems. His complete knowledge of military matters has made the administration of this Headquarters a pleasant and interesting duty. In behalf of all of the personnel of the Iowa State Guard, it is a pleasure to extend sincere thanks.

POST WAR REORGANIZATION-IOWA NATIONAL GUARD

Prior to the cessation of hostilities and the signing of the surrender by the Japanese on 2 September 1945, considerable study had been

given to the reorganization of the National Guard. Units of the Iowa National Guard entered active Federal service early in 1941, and were completely deactivated upon demobilization. It is, therefore, necessary that new allocations and a complete reorganization be effected.

The War Department has announced the National Guard Troop Basis to include a grand total of 47,817 Officers, 2,525 Warrant Officers, and 631,994 Enlisted Men, for an aggregate of 682,336.

In the above troop basis, the State of Iowa was requested to accept and organize the headquarters and units set forth in the attached tabulation. The 34th Infantry Division is to be divided between the States of Iowa and Nebraska. In conference with representatives of the Adjutant General's Office, Nebraska, it was mutually agreed that personnel of Headquarters, 34th Infantry Division, would be initially allocated as follows:

The agreement further provided that the Division Commander and the Assistant Division Commander will not be allocated to the same state at the same time; that the Chief of Staff will, in the event of a vacancy, always be allocated to the same state as the Division Commander; that in the event of a vacancy in the grade of Lieutenant Colonel on either of the General or Special Staffs, the Assistant in the section shall fill the created vacancy.

Units of the Air National Guard are to be given first priority in the reorganization. Plans are now going forward to present the air units for Federal Recognition as soon as possible subsequent to 1 July 1946.

The troop basis allocated to Iowa has been accepted, subject to Federal assistance in constructing and renovating armories, and the enactment of some type of Universal Military Training to assure maintenance of enlisted strengths. In the initial period of reorganization air units will be authorized 100% of both officers and enlisted men. Army units will be authorized 100% officers and 80% enlisted men. The aggregate reduced strengths are to be reached in successive stages.

A Reorganization Section has been created in the office of the Adjutant General of Iowa. This section is proceeding with plans for the reorganization, and satisfactory progress is being made. All communities which supported National Guard units prior to mobilization are desirous of obtaining units. Many other localities have applied

for units. There is every indication that the troop basis allocated to and accepted by the State of Iowa will be reached in accordance with the time schedule desired by the National Guard Bureau.
