SUBJECT: Biennial Report

TO: HIS EXCELLENCY, Robert D. Blue, Governor and
Commander-in-Chief, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.

1. In accordance with the provisions of Section 29.44 of Chapter 28 of the Code of Iowa of 1946, there is submitted herewith Biennial Report of the Adjutant General's Department during the period 1 July 1946 to 30 June 1948.

a. PERSONNEL.

During the period covered by this report units of the post-war Iowa National Guard were activated and successfully completed a Five Day School (Summer Encampment). Through the medium of schools and extension courses the training has progressed in a very satisfactory manner, and officers and men are taking every opportunity to better qualify themselves.

b. DEACTIVATION OF STATE GUARD.

A report in connection with the deactivation of the Iowa State Guard is contained in this report.

2. CAMP DODGE. Additional storage buildings to handle postwar National Guard equipment have been constructed for the most part with Federal funds.

3. A detailed report of the transactions of the Iowa National Guard prepared by Colonel Ralph A. Lancaster, Assistant Adjutant General of Iowa, is contained in this report. A summary concerning the reorganization of the Iowa National Guard, including the allocation of units to the State of Iowa, the activation and location of such units, is also contained in this report.

4. Mr. Charles E. Roberts, Director, Graves Registration Service, has submitted a report concerning the activities of that department during the period covered by this Biennial Report.

5. This report also contains General Orders, Financial Reports, and other activities pertaining to the Iowa National Guard.

6. To you, Governor, I extend the thanks of the entire Iowa National Guard for your sincere understanding of the problems which confront us and your hearty support and cooperation in matters pertaining to this department. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable circumstances.

INACTIVATION OF THE IOWA STATE GUARD

Inactivation of the Iowa State Guard was started on 19 February 1947 and progressed as rapidly as reorganization of the Iowa National Guard would permit.

Final units of the Iowa State Guard were inactivated and all remaining personnel discharged effective 17 September 1947.

REORGANIZATION, IOWA NATIONAL GUARD

Beginning with ultimate aggregate authorized T/O&E Strength of 12,559 men, actual reorganization of the Iowa National Guard was initiated with the activation of the 132d Fighter Group (SE) and the 124th Fighter SQ (SE) and attached units, at Des Moines, Iowa.

2. A total of 73 officers and enlisted men attended these schools during this period. It is anticipated that a much larger percentage of attendance will be attained during the next two years.

EXAMINATIONS FOR UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY

Under Act of Congress, approved 4 May 1916, the Governor of Iowa is authorized each year to nominate one or more enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard to take the final examination for entrance to the United States Military Academy. The statutes provide that the persons nominated must be selected through the medium of a competitive examination.

The State of Iowa was authorized the selection of two candidates for the calendar year 1947. Only one application was received and accepted and the candidate took the required preliminary competitive mental examination but was later disqualified physically.

OPERATION 88,888

A national recruiting campaign, known as "Operation 88,888", was conducted during the period 16 September—16 November 1947, with marked success.

During this period of intensive recruiting the strength of the Iowa National Guard increased from 2566 officers and enlisted men to a total of 3751 men, a net gain of 1185 men.

During the course of the operation the champion recruiter for each State was selected and awarded an all-expense trip to Washington, D. C.

Cpl. John M. Nicks, Co. A, 133rd Inf., Dubuque, was selected champion recruiter for the State of Iowa, with a total of 71 recruits to his credit. Cpl. Nicks departed for Washington, D. C., on 25 November 1947 and returned to home station 2 December 1947.

1. Transmitted herewith for your approval is the Biennial Report for the Graves Registration Records Division. This Report covers the period 1 July 1946 to 30 June 1948, a period of great activity in Graves Registration work throughout the State of Iowa, as evidenced by the large increase of records processed for permanent filing;

2. The Repatriation Program for return of WW No. 2 deceased from overseas cemeteries commenced 25 October 1947, with the arrival and reburial in Iowa, of the first remains under this program. It is anticipated that, before the completion of the Repatriation Program in early 1950, over 3200 remains of Iowa's War Dead will have been returned to this State for reburial. The foregoing number of reburials will be increased by a considerable number, due to the reburial of non-resident WW No. 2 deceased, who will be buried in the U. S. National Cemetery at Keokuk, Iowa.

3. A system has been installed in this office that will facilitate the location of and status of receipt of Records pertaining to the arrival and reburial of the above remains.

4. Facilities for training on a large scale are considered inadequate at Camp Dodge, Iowa, and it is anticipated that future field training will be conducted at some Army installation outside the State.

PAYMENT FOR TRAVEL AND DUTIES PERFORMED

I. PAYMENT FOR TRAVEL AND DUTIES PERFORMED.

1. The following Regulations will govern payment for travel and duties performed by members of the Iowa National Guard pursuant to orders issued by The Adjutant General.

a. **BOARDS:**

Members of the Armory, Advisory, Examining, and Special Boards will, when attending a meeting of the Board, be allowed the base pay of their grade and actual necessary expenses not to exceed \$5.00 per day for each day the Board is in session, and transportation, including Pullman fare and Parlor Car charges, when necessary, from home station to the place specified.

b. **GOVERNOR'S STAFF:**

Members of the Governor's Military Staff, when ordered to duty will be allowed actual necessary expenses not to exceed \$5.00 per day, and transportation, including Pullman fare and Parlor Car charges, when necessary, from home station to the place specified, and return.

c. **VISITS OF INSPECTION AND INSTRUCTION:**

All officers and enlisted men detailed to perform visits of inspection and instruction will be allowed actual necessary expenses not to exceed \$5.00 per day, during the period of ordered duty, and transportation, including Pullman fare and Parlor Car charges, when necessary, from home station to place of ordered duty, and return.

d. **OFFICERS, ENLISTED MEN, AND CANDIDATES ORDERED BEFORE EXAMINING BOARDS:**

Officers and enlisted men and candidates ordered before Examining Boards for examination will be allowed actual necessary expenses not to exceed \$5.00 per day, during the period of ordered duty, and transportation, including Pullman fare and Parlor Car charges, when necessary, from home station to place specified for examination, and return.

e. **OFFICERS AND ENLISTED MEN ORDERED TO PERFORM SPECIAL DUTIES WHICH REQUIRE TRAVEL:**

Officers and enlisted men, ordered to perform special duties which require travel, will be allowed actual necessary expenses not to exceed \$5.00 per day during the period of such ordered duty, and transportation, including Pullman fare and Parlor Car charges, when necessary, from home station to the place of ordered duty, and return.

f. **TRAVEL BY AUTOMOBILE:**

Reimbursement on the basis of 5c per mile for the shortest usually traveled distance will be authorized, when travel is performed by privately owned automobile, unless otherwise specified.

g. **TRAVEL BY AIRCRAFT:**

Reimbursement on the basis of actual Railroad fare (less Federal tax) will be authorized when travel is performed by privately owned airplane, unless otherwise specified.

2. In addition to the above cited provisions governing reimbursement for travel and duties performed by all personnel connected with the Iowa National Guard, all claims for reimbursement will be subject to the following provisions of extracts of rules and regulations issued by the State Comptroller.

"Rule 3. All claims must be prepared on the typewriter or in ink. If typewritten, the original must be filed." (Such additional copies of claims as are required by the officer certifying claim shall be furnished by the claimant.)

"Rule 5. Where telephone or telegraph service is used, statement as to the necessity for same and the name of person with whom communication is held must be filed with the claim. In view of the fact that the expenditures for telephone and telegraph by the employees of the State are becoming enormous, the State Comptroller feels the necessity for urging upon each department the curtailment of such expense and suggests that whenever practical, telegrams or the mails be substituted for telephone communication."

"Rule 6. * * * Charge for breakfast will not be allowed when the train leaves claimant's residence or domicile after 7:00 A.M."

"Rule 7. Receipts shall be filed for all items of one dollar or over, covering incidental expenditures and for telephone and telegraph (except from booth—in which case statement to that effect may be made)."

NOTE 3. Pullman fares and dining car meals should be charged under the heading "Hotel Expense" and railroad and bus fares should be charged under the heading "Transportation."

3. Claims for reimbursement will be submitted, in duplicate, as early as practicable, upon completion of duties performed, on Form No. 1 or 1-B, AGO Iowa. All copies must be signed and the claimant's signature witnessed by an officer authorized to administer an oath. The following remark will be entered on all copies following the last listed item of expense:

SECTION I. Allowances of State Funds

a. Armory Rental Allowances

Armory rental allowances are fixed by the State Armory Board, and will be forwarded to organization commanders on or about the tenth of the month following the close of each calendar quarter (April, July, October, January).

b. Headquarters Allowances

(1) Headquarters Allowances are fixed by the State Armory Board. Expenditures from this allowance are limited to the purchase of stationery and office supplies, not otherwise furnished, postage, telephone service, official long distance toll, official telegrams, and any other specific expenditures authorized in advance, in writing by the Adjutant General of Iowa.

(2) The following Headquarters Allowances are established for the period ending 30 June 1947, to be paid in advance on a pro rata basis from 1 January 1947 or the date a unit is inspected for federal recognition—whichever is the latest date. The prorated allowance will be paid the commanding officer of each headquarters or unit heretofore inspected for federal recognition on or about 10 January 1947 or within approximately 10 days following date of inspection for federal recognition.

c. Per Capita Drill Allowance

(1) Under the provisions of Section 467.52, Code of Iowa 1939, a Per Capita (Drill) Allowance of Four Dollars (\$4.00 per capita, computed on the basis of the average enlisted strength during each semi-annual period, will be paid to each organization commander. This allowance will normally be paid on or about July 15 and January 15, each year—after

the average enlisted strength for the preceding semi-annual period has been computed. It is considered desirable that some funds, in addition to the Headquarters Allowance, be made available to each organization commander immediately after the inspection of his unit for Federal Recognition. This will be considered an advance payment as the balance of the Per Capita Allowance due the unit will be paid at the time the allowance is actually due.

(2) The following advance payments will be made on or about 10 January 1947 to units inspected for Federal Recognition prior to 1 January 1947. Units inspected for Federal Recognition subsequent to 1 January 1947 will receive a pro rata portion of the indicated advance payments.

Units with an aggregate enlisted strength, second stage, of 5 to 10 enlisted men.....	\$10.00
Units with an aggregate enlisted strength, second stage, of 11 to 20 enlisted men.....	\$25.00
Units with an aggregate enlisted strength, second stage, of 21 to 30 enlisted men.....	\$50.00
Units with an aggregate enlisted strength, second stage, of 31 to 40 enlisted men.....	\$60.00
Units with an aggregate enlisted strength, second stage, of 41 to 50 enlisted men.....	\$75.00
Units with an aggregate enlisted strength, second stage, of 51 or more enlisted men.....	\$90.00

(3) Expenditures from this allowance will be restricted to purchase of items and payment of services which contribute to the welfare, comfort, and contentment; the mental and physical improvement of the enlisted personnel or the military efficiency of the unit. In general, disbursements from this allowance will be restricted to:

- Cartage of military stores, supplies and equipment, when necessary.
- Athletic equipment.
- Club room fixtures.
- Military text books not issued.
- Payment for supplies and services which would ordinarily be paid from other allowances, when such allowances are not adequate, but only upon the prior, written approval of the Adjutant General of Iowa.

A reasonable amount may be disbursed from this allowance for the purpose of relieving a responsible officer for property lost, stolen or destroyed for which such officer is held pecuniarily liable on approved Report of Survey. The specific written approval of the Company Council and the prior written authority of The Adjutant General of Iowa shall be obtained before such disbursement may be made. The Company Council shall be composed of two commissioned officers of the unit, other than the responsible officer, and the two senior noncommissioned officers. When there are but two officers assigned to a unit, the Company Council may be composed of one commissioned officer, other than the responsible officer, and the two senior noncommissioned officers.

Disbursements from this allowance for entertainment, refreshments, social activities or dances are prohibited.

Any unauthorized expenditures will be disallowed and the unit commander will be required to reimburse the allowance from personal or other funds in the amount of the disallowance.

Overdrafts on this allowance are not authorized.

All non-expendable property purchased from this allowance will be carried on the records of the State Quartermaster as State Property, and organization commanders shall be responsible for such items to the same extent they are responsible for non-expendable items of Federal property.

All payments from this allowance shall be made by Voucher Check (Form No. 6, AGO Iowa), on which must be itemized the articles or services purchased, care being exercised to use proper and correct nomenclature. It is permissible and may be desirable to attach the vendor's itemized statement to each cancelled Voucher Check, but in such event, a duplicate statement will be retained by the unit.

SECTION II. Accounting for State Funds—Accounts Current

a. Accounts Current shall be maintained in duplicate on Form No. 7, AGO Iowa.

b. Entries shall be made promptly at the time allowances are received or disbursed.

c. All disbursements shall be made by Voucher Check—Form No. 6, AGO, Iowa.

d. Allowances are payable to commanding officers only, who by virtue of their offices are hereby designated as disbursing officers and custodians of State Funds. Accounts Current shall be closed on 30 June and 31 December of each calendar year, or immediately upon relief from duty or assignment. The original copy of Accounts Current, containing all prescribed entries and accompanied by the cancelled voucher checks issued during the period covered by the Account Current, shall be submitted to the Adjutant General of Iowa immediately following 30 June and 31 December, and must reach the Adjutant General not later than 20 July and 20 January, respectively. The Accounts Current shall be accompanied by the original bank statement for the last month of the accounting period, showing the balance on deposit in the State Funds account.

e. Warrants issued by the State of Iowa in payment of any State Allowance shall be indorsed by the payee and deposited in an accredited banking institution in a single fund to be known as "State Funds, Company ".....",th Infantry, Iowa NG," or as the case may be. Company funds or funds derived from sources other than the State of Iowa, will not be deposited in this account.

f. The lending of money from any of the allowances received from the State of Iowa is prohibited.

SECTION III. Office Supplies

Each headquarters and unit of the Iowa National Guard will be issued an initial supply of expendable office supplies upon inspection for Federal Recognition. Further instructions pertaining to expendable office

supplies and the method of requisitioning for replenishment will be issued by the United States Property and Disbursing Officer.

1. Headquarters Allowance.

a. Headquarters Allowance for each organization is payable semi-annually in advance. This allowance will normally be distributed to organizations between the 15th and 31st of January and July of each year.

b. Expenditures from this allowance are limited to the purchase of stationery and office supplies not otherwise furnished, postage, telephone service, including official long distance telephone tolls, official telegrams, and any other specific purposes authorized in writing in advance by The Adjutant General of Iowa.

c. All disbursements from this fund will be made by voucher check (Form 111 AGO Iowa) provided by this office, on which must be itemized the articles or services purchased. It is permissible to attach the vendor's itemized statement to the canceled voucher check, making reference to such attached itemized statement.

2. Per Capita (Drill) Allowance

Under the provisions of Section 29.52, Code of Iowa, 1947, a Per Capita (Drill) Allowance of Four Dollars (\$4.00) per Capita, computed on the basis of the average enlisted strength during each semi-annual period, will be provided each company, troop, battery, or detachment commander. This allowance will normally be paid between the 15th and 31st of January and July of each year.

a. Expenditures from this allowance will be restricted to the purchase of articles and payment of services which contribute to the welfare, comfort, contentment and mental physical improvement of the **enlisted** personnel or the military efficiency of the unit. Disbursements from this allowance will be restricted to:

Cartage of military stores, supplies and equipment, when necessary.

Athletic equipment.

Club room fixtures.

Military text books not issued.

Payment for supplies and services which would ordinarily be paid from other allowances, when such allowances are not adequate, but only upon the prior, **written approval of the Adjutant General of Iowa.**

A reasonable amount may be disbursed from this allowance for the purpose of relieving a responsible officer for property lost, stolen or destroyed for which such officer is held pecuniarily liable an approved Report of Survey. The specific written approval of the Company Council and the prior written authority of The Adjutant General of Iowa shall be obtained before such disbursement may be made. The Company Council shall be composed of two commissioned officers of the unit, other than the responsible officer, and the two senior noncommissioned officers. When there are but two officers assigned to a unit, the Company Council may be composed of one commissioned officer, other than the responsible officer, and the two senior noncommissioned officers.

Disbursements from this allowance for entertainment, refreshments, social activities or dances are prohibited.

Any unauthorized expenditures will be disallowed and

the unit commander will be required to reimburse the allowance from personal or other funds in the amount of the disallowance.

Overdrafts on this allowance are not authorized.

All non-expendable property purchased from this allowance will be carried on the records of the State Quartermaster as State Property, and organization commanders shall be responsible for such items to the same extent they are responsible for non-expendable times of Federal property.

All disbursements from this fund will be made by voucher check (Form 111 AGO Iowa) provided by this office, on which must be itemized the articles or services purchased. It is permissible to attach the vendor's itemized statement to the canceled voucher check, making reference to such attached itemized statement.

SECTION III. ACCOUNTING FOR STATE FUNDS.

Effective 1 January 1948, each officer receiving State Funds will maintain a work sheet on which will be entered all receipts and disbursements, Form 112 AGO Iowa (buff) will be used for this work sheet. All receipts and disbursements of State Funds will be entered currently.

Approximately thirty (30) days prior to the end of each accounting period, each unit commander receiving State Funds will be provided with an Account Current (Form 112 AGO Iowa (white) upon which will be entered the balance of State Funds in each account at the beginning of the accounting period and State Funds received during the accounting period. This form will be completed by each unit commander, to indicate the expenditures and the balance on hand as of the final date of the accounting period. Completed Accounts Current, accompanied by bank statements and canceled voucher checks, will be transmitted in duplicate to The Adjutant General of Iowa not later than the 15th day of the month following the close of each accounting period. This procedure will be effective for the accounting period 1 January—30 June 1948.

Each unit commander receiving State Funds will be responsible that Accounts Current are submitted promptly as provided herein. No State Allowance will be distributed to any organization until an Account Current for the preceding period has been submitted and cleared.

Warrants issued by the State of Iowa in payment of any State Allowance shall be endorsed by the payee and deposited in an accredited banking institution in a single fund to be known as "State Funds, Company _____, _____th Inf, Iowa NG", or as the case may be. Company funds, unit funds or funds derived from sources other than the State of Iowa shall not be deposited in this account.

The lending of money from any of the allowances received from the State of Iowa is prohibited.

Any unexpended balances will be withdrawn and transmitted to the Adjutant General of Iowa by voucher check attached to Account Current.

The Commanding Officer, Medical Detachment, 194th Field Artillery Battalion, will complete the Service Records and Qualification Cards of

the enlisted men, and deliver such completed records to the Commanding Officer, Company A, 109th Medical Battalion.

Federal recognition will be withdrawn from the Medical Detachment, 194th Field Artillery Battalion as of midnight, 15 June 1948.

(The Medical Detachment, 194th Field Artillery Battalion, will be re-organized at Algona, Iowa, effective 16 June 1948.)
