

# SUBJECT: Biennial Report.

To: HIS EXCELLENCY, Bourke B. Hickenlooper, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.

1. In accordance with the provisions of Section 467.44 of Chapter 28 of the Code of Iowa, 1939, there is submitted herewith the Biennial Report of the Adjutant General's Department during the period July 1, 1942, to June 30, 1944.

2. A detailed report of the transactions of the Iowa State Guard, prepared by Colonel Arthur T. Wallace, Chief of Staff, Iowa State Guard, is contained in this report.

3. Lt. Col. Charles R. Clift, State Guard Property Officer was requested to furnish information on Camp Dodge. His report is included in this Biennial Report.

4. Mr. Edwin H. Curtis, Ex. Secy., has submitted a report for this two year period with reference to the Iowa Soldiers' Bonus Board, which has been incorporated in this volume.

5. The Report for the Iowa Aeronautics Commission included herein has been furnished by the Secretary thereof.

6. This report also contains general orders published, financial report and details of other activities.

7. To you, Governor, I extend the thanks of the entire Iowa National Guard and Iowa State Guard, for your sympathetic understanding of the problems which confront us and for your hearty support and cooperation in matters pertaining to this department. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable conditions and circumstances.



# SUBJECT: Biennial Report-Iowa State Guard.

To: Brigadier General Charles H. Grahl, The Adjutant General of Iowa, State House, Des Moines, Iowa.

1. In compliance with directions contained in your letter dated 21 August 1944, that a report of the administration and operations of the Iowa State Guard, during the period 1 July 1942 to 30 June 1944, be furnished you, the following is respectfully submitted.

2. During the month of December 1941, George A. Wilson, then Governor of the State of Iowa, under authority contained in Senate File 306, 49th General Assembly of Iowa organized the Iowa State Guard to provide military protection for the State of Iowa during that period of time that the Iowa National Guard was in Federal Service.

3. On 14 December 1941, Lt. General Mathew A. Tinley, Retired, having been appointed the Commanding General of the Iowa State Guard by Governor George A. Wilson assumed command of this military force. Colonel Percy A. Lainson, Iowa State Guard was assigned to duty as Chief of Staff. Colonel Gerald V. Caughlan of Council Bluffs and Colonel Otto I. Ronningen of Ames, having been commissioned Colonels in the Iowa State Guard, were assigned to command the First and Second Regiments respectively of this organization. Each regiment consisted of 16 companies of 3 officers and 60 men, each, and a medical detachment of 5 officers and 30 enlisted men each. The First Regiment occupies the Southern half of the State and the Second Regiment occupies the Northern half. In addition to the organization of the two regiments of Infantry a State Headquarters Company was authorized and organized at Des Moines and a State Supply Company was organized at Knoxville. State Headquarters were set up and are now maintained in the office of the Adjutant General of Iowa in the State House in Des Moines. On 30 July 1942 Colonel Percy A. Lainson, Iowa State Guard, was relieved from active duty as Chief of Staff and Lt. Colonel John T. Lonsdale, First Military Police Battalion, Iowa State Guard was appointed to succeed him. On 17 October 1942, Lt. Col. John T. Lonsdale, Chief of Staff of the Iowa State Guard having resigned his commission in the Iowa State Guard to enter the federal military forces was succeeded by Colonel

Arthur T. Wallace, Iowa State Guard who now holds this assignment.

During the month of February, 1942, Governor George A. Wilson authorized the activation of the Provisional Military Police Battalion, Iowa State Guard. This organization reported for duty and intensive training at Camp Dodge, Iowa on 10 March 1942. On 9 June 1942 it was reorganized as the First Military Police Battalion, Iowa State Guard. This unit which had an authorized strength of 26 officers and 260 enlisted men remained on active duty until 15 March 1943 on which date it was disbanded.

4. The authorized strength of the Iowa State Guard is 168 officers and 2107 enlisted men. The actual strength of this organization, as of 30 June 1944, was 166 officers and 1812 enlisted men. The Iowa State Guard on 30 June 1944 consisted of a Headquarters, Headquarters Detachment and two regiments of infantry, a more particular description of which is set out in appendix No. 1 of this report.

5. The name, rank, branch of the service of each of the commissioned personnel of the Iowa State Guard is set out in appendix No. 2 of this report.

6. The training year of the Iowa State Guard is divided into the Armory Training Period and the Field Training Period. The Armory Training Period covers 50 weeks of the calendar year, with 100 hours of training prescribed. The Field Training period for each regiment is of two weeks duration with 76<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hours of training prescribed.

7. The Armory Training is that training which can be efficiently carried on in the several armories in this state. In general it consists of training in the school of the soldier, discipline, use and care of arms, material and equipment, close order drill, riot duty, traffic control, leadership, responsibility of commanders, defense against chemicals and marksmanship. The armory training is accomplished by following programs and schedules prepared by the G-3 section of the Iowa State Guard.

8. The Field Training Period of the Iowa State Guard is of four weeks duration. This training is conducted by regiments, with each regiment so engaged for a period of two weeks. This training consists of the application of practical exercises in the Field of such theoretical and practical knowledge as has been gained during the Armory Training Period. The Field Training of the Iowa State Guard in 1943 was held at Camp Dodge from 6 June 1943 to 3 July 1943. The Second Regiment trained from 6 June 1943 to 19 June 1943. The First Regiment from 20 June 1943 to 3 July 1943. The attendance at this

period of Field Training was 157 officers and 1386 men. Staff officers of the Iowa State Guard trained at Camp Dodge from 17 June 1943 to 22 June 1943. Field Training of the Iowa State Guard for the year 1944 will be conducted at Camp Dodge, Iowa, from 9 July 1944 to 5 August 1944. The Second Regiment will train during the first two week period and the First Regiment during the second two weeks. Fifteen Staff Officers will also train at this station from 9 July to 14 July 1944.

9. Training Inspections are made at frequent intervals, by officers of the G-3 (Plans and Training) section of the Iowa State Guard, to observe the progress being made and to determine whether or not the prescribed programs and schedules are being carried out. In addition to inspections made by officers of the Iowa State Guard, an annual inspection of each unit is made by officers of the United States Army from the Headquarters of the Seventh Service Command, Omaha, Nebraska. Training inspections made by officers of the Iowa State Guard during the years 1942, 1943 and 1944 are as follows:

Inspections made by officers of the U. S. Army numbered 13 in the year 1942, 39 in the year 1943 and 37 in the year 1944. These inspections have been zealously carried on in order that the Iowa State Guard may be kept at a high rate of efficiency so that each unit may be prepared at all times for use by the State for the suppression of domestic disturbances or insurrections and to aid civil authorities where the need arises.

10. Units of the Iowa State Guard have been called to active duty during the period of time, covered by this report, on 18 different occasions. In every instance the mission has been in aid of civil authorities and in connection with floods, cyclones, cloudbursts, crash of army air craft and the apprehension of fugitives from justice. A detailed account of active duty missions performed by units of the Iowa State Guard during the period of time above referred to is shown in appendix No. 3 of this report.

11. The administration of the Iowa State Guard is carried on from the Headquarters of this organization, which are located, in the office of the Adjutant General at the State House in Des Moines. The Chief of Staff, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-1, (personnel) and the Assistant Chief of Staff G-3 (Plans and Training) are on an active duty status at this station. In addition to the three commissioned officers mentioned, three enlisted men are on active duty at these Headquarters in the same connection.

12. The commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Iowa State Guard has changed appreciably during the period of time covered by this report. This has been due largely to the entry of many of the members of this organization into the armed forces of the United States. This condition, has been more pronounced among the enlisted personnel of the organization rather than among the commissioned officers. The appointment and promotion of commissioned officers of the Iowa State Guard, as well as, separations of commissioned officers from this organization during the period covered by this report is set out in appendix No. 4 of this report.

13. The expenditures of state funds necessary for the administration, training, equipment and maintenance of the Iowa State Guard for the year commencing 1 July 1942 and ending 30 June 1943 were in the amount of \$536,772.75 and for the period of time commencing 1 July 1943 and ending 30 June 1944, were in the sum of \$256,497.28. An itemized statement of expenditures made, as above referred to, is set out in appendix No. 5 of this report.

14. All general orders published by the Headquarters of the Iowa State Guard during the period commencing 1 July 1942 and ending 30 June 1944, are attached to this report, in chronological order, and by this reference made a part hereof.

15. In keeping with an avowed policy that the Iowa State Guard, shall, at all times be kept trained to a high state of efficiency, a system of holding three schools each year for Battalion Officers was inaugurated. These schools are of one day's duration. They are held at some convenient place, selected by the Battalion Commander, within the Battalion Area. The value of these schools as a training medium has been gratifying, and, in the best interests of this organization, should be continued. During the period of time covered by this report each of the six battalions of the Iowa State Guard has held nine of these schools.

16. On 9 January 1943 the Seventh Service Command, Army Service Forces activated a school for the Officers of the several State Guards within its area. This school was conducted by officers of the Army of the United States and each school period was of two weeks duration. Under authority granted by the Governor of Iowa 36 officers of the Iowa State Guard, were ordered to active duty and attended this school. The grades, made by each of the officers attending this school, were furnished these Headquarters by the Commandant of this school and it is interesting to note that in each period an officer of the Iowa State Guard received the highest grade of all officers in attendance. The training received by the officers of the Iowa State Guard at this school was exceptionally beneficial and has been definitely reflected in the work of these officers since their return.

17. On 11-12 March, 1944 by authority of the Governor of Iowa, a conference of all officers of the Iowa State Guard was held in Des Moines. Headquarters for this conference were located at the Hotel Fort Des Moines and it was well attended. This conference did much to enhance the morale of the commissioned personnel of this organization and it is recommended that such a conference be held annually.

18. Mention should be made in this report that in all of the active duty missions performed by the units of the Iowa State Guard, the service rendered has been of great value to the people of the State of Iowa. Each mission was accomplished with dispatch and efficiency. Reports reaching these Head-quarters relative to the conduct and performance of the troops have been commendatory. The services rendered by Iowa State Guard Troops in connection with the several flood emergencies has been of incalculable value. Lives were saved and damage to property averted. The saving in property damage alone has been authoratively estimated to be many times the cost of these missions.

19. In concluding this report attention is invited to the fact, that during the period of time covered by this report, the splendid cooperation from the members of the armed forces stationed in this state, particularly, in the Des Moines Area has been generous and most helpful. The intelligent and sympathetic supervision given the Iowa State Guard by you, General Grahl, has been of inestimable value and has helped solve many vexatious problems. This has made the administration of these Headquarters a pleasant task and on behalf of the entire personnel of the Iowa State Guard, sincere thanks are extended.

I. General Orders No. 5-A Rescinded.

1. The provisions of General Orders Number 5-A, dated June 16, 1942, are hereby rescinded effective this date.

1. Pursuant to authority of the Governor of Iowa, and Section 467.14, Chapter 28.1, Code of Iowa, 1939, as amended by Senate File 306, 49th General Assembly, there is hereby created an Iowa State Guard Inactive List.

III. Transfer of Officers.

1. Officers of the Iowa State Guard not specifically assigned to certain duties, or who may be relieved of their duties either at their own request or at the request of their Commanding Officer, immediate or remote, may be placed in the Iowa State Guard Inactive List by Special Orders from these Headquarters.

# IV. Status of Officers.

1. Officers placed in the Iowa State Guard Inactive List will retain their rank and seniority, except that they may not be transferred back to the active list unless a vacancy occurs in the tables of organization.

# V. Transfer of Enlisted Men.

1. Enlisted men may be placed in the Iowa State Guard Inactive List by Special Orders from these Headquarters upon the request of their respective Company Commanders, and may also be returned to active duty in the same way, providing vacancies exist in their respective organizations.

VI. Status of Enlisted Men.

1. All transfers of enlisted men to and from the Iowa State Guard Inactive List will be in grade of Private. Enlisted men on the Inactive List will be carried on the rolls of their respective Companies following the list of active members, and under the heading **Inactive**. They may be in addition to the authorized strength of the unit.

VII. Discharge.

1. Members of the Enlisted Inactive List who leave the State or become otherwise unavailable for duty in emergency will be discharged to avoid unnecessary paper work. Discharges will be accomplished in the regular manner, except that time served in the Inactive List will not be counted as active service in line four on the Discharge Certificate.

VIII. Enlistment on Inactive Basis.

1. With the approval of the Commanding General, direct enlistment on an inactive basis, and assignment to the Headquarters Company, Iowa State Guard is authorized. Physical examination of individuals enlisted under authority of this paragraph may be waived, provided that a general indemnity waiver is executed. Provided, however, that in the event such individuals are transferred to active duty status or called to active duty the customary physical examination will be made.

## MEMORANDUM TO THE ADJUTANT GENERAL:

Pursuant to your request of 21 August regarding information for the biennial report of the Adjutant General for the period July 1, 1942 to June 30, 1944, the following information is furnished:

All of Camp Dodge except that area retained for the use of the Iowa State Guard has been under lease to the United States of America for the period of time mentioned above. This included the operation of the pumping station, heating plant, sewage treatment plant and electrical distribution; also the maintenance of the rifle range, rifle range road, paving and maintenance of all grounds and buildings leased to the United States of America. Heat for the south arsenal and warehouse No. 2, and electricity and water were purchased from the United States of America.

The buildings retained for use of the Iowa State Guard have been maintained in good repair and the grounds have been properly cared for in order that the area be maintained in a suitable condition for the use of the Iowa State Guard during the field training period, or at any other time desired.

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Nine frame buildings formerly used as stables by the 113th Cavalry were remodeled into barracks and provided housing for approximately forty men each. The adjacent ground was graded and a gravel service road established along the east entrances to these buildings.

A furnace and coal room was built into the basement of Headquarters building No. 100 and a hot air heating plant installed which heats the entire building very satisfactorily.

Third Street was graded and black-topped from Main Avenue to Des

Moines Avenue and the service road back of Headquarters building No. 100 was graded and black-topped from the intersection of Third Street and the gravel drive commonly referred to as "Burma Road", to the point where the service road joins Des Moines Avenue in the south end of the State Guard area.

A new mineral surfaced roof was placed on Building No. 1 which is now used as a carpenter shop warehouse of the Iowa State Guard area, federal funds having been provided by the National Guard Bureau.

During the period of time mentioned above it was necessary to prepare Headquarters Building No. 100 and ten mess halls for winter use for the First Military Police Battalion which was on duty at Camp Dodge from March 15, 1942 to March 15, 1943. This was accomplished by lining the second floor of Headquarters Building No. 100 with Celotex, reflooring the entire building and replacing the old batten shutters with windows. It was necessary to remove the batten shutters from the ten mess halls and install windows in their place. Mess halls Nos. 108 and 109 were remodeled to accommodate 120 men each and are now provided with new type mess tables.

The building which was originally constructed as a regimental supply building in the 113th Cavalry area was also prepared for winter use as a canteen and a ceiling constructed of Celotex was added to the building, together with counters and partitions.

The building just south of the office which originally was to have been constructed to be used as a regimental supply building and which was a part of the WPA project here at Camp Dodge, was under construction by the WPA at the time that the project at Camp Dodge was discontinued. The unfinished portion of the building was then completed at State expense and this building has served as a repair shop and garage for the Iowa State Guard vehicles.

The state bonus board consists of the state auditor, the state treasurer, the adjutant general and the adjutant of the Iowa department of the American Legion.

The Bonus Board is charged with the administration of the balance of funds appropriated to pay the Iowa Soldiers, a bonus. The final date of filing for the bonus was December 31, 1924. Claims filed after December 31, 1924 were marked "Too Late" and placed on file. The law provided that the balance should be used on needy, disabled veterans and this is paid out in the form of an Additional Disability Bonus, to the veteran, on certification from the County Soldiers' Relief Commission and approval of the Bonus Board. One third of the estimated cost of the veteran's necessary need, per month, is assumed by the Bonus Board in the cases of veterans, who are

disabled to the extent of being unable to follow a gainful occupation and are needy. The ever increasing age of the veteran also increases his disability and the number gradually increases. During the past two years \$64,782.65 was expended to the veterans of Iowa. The expenditures during this biennium have decreased due to the fact that many disabled veterans are now being employed.

The Fiftieth General Assembly reopened the payment of the World War I Bonus to those who had failed to receive it during the former period of payment. We have processed several thousand claims but only paid 466 claims amounting to \$81,685.00. The law went into effect July 5, 1943 and the closing date for filing is December 31, 1944.

Many orphans were made by the World War and the State of Iowa enacted into law, the World War Orphans' Educational Aid bill in order that these children would be able to receive the proper education and the Bonus Board was charged with the administration of the fund. Due to the age of these orphans the number participating is rapidly decreasing and before many more years pass by, all who wish this aid will have finished school or be in vocations where the aid is no longer needed. The amount granted to any one student must not exceed \$150.00 per year.

## IOWA AERONAUTICS COMMISSION

The Iowa Aeronautics Commission realizing the tremendous strides that aviation was making in the war effort, felt that we should keep ourselves well informed in its progress. We also realized that with the great number of pilots being trained by the Armed Forces and other personnel receiving aeronautical training that we must look to the future in planning postwar aviation. The Commission has carefully watched the tremendous strides in the development of super-fortresses and fast pursuit planes.

In 1943 commission members attended all of the large aviation clinics held throughout the United States, Airline officials, technicians, aviation experts from the armed forces, airline manufacturers and designers, airport executives and managers, airport officials and operators attended these clinics representing every state in the union. Airport design and maintenance were thoroughly discussed at these conferences together with the airplanes of the future and the great possibilities of aviation in the transportation field. Attendance at these conferences is better fitting us to advise and help guide in the construction of a number of airports throughout the state. The Commission, with the ever-increasing demand from cities for help in airport planning, helped advise and promote bond issues in some twenty Iowa cities and communities. The bond issues in these cities have been successfully voted and you will soon find some twenty new airports added to our rapidly growing number. The Commission has given talks on aviation in many cities which are planning airports in the immediate future. This, together with the thirtyfive designated airports in the State, will keep Iowa well in line with other states of equal population.

The Commission recognizing the fact Iowa Aeronautics Laws should be brought up-to-date, due to the ever increasing number of airports and rapidly growing interests shown by the citizens of Iowa in aviation, has spent considerable time and effort in conjunction with other state officials, trying to draft a uniform state law on aviation that would be adopted by all forty-eight states. We are working with and through other aviation bodies in the state.

The Commission hopes the state can have an airway marker system in every town and city throughout the state to assist aviators flying cross country. Suitable plans are under consideration at the present time.

SECTION I. DISBANDMENT OF FIRST MILITARY POLICE BAT-TALION, IOWA STATE GUARD. 1. Effective March 15, 1943, the First Military Police Battalion, Iowa State Guard, Camp Dodge, Des Moines, Iowa, will be disbanded.

2. 6. Pay rolls will be prepared and submitted to the Adjutant General's Office, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa, to enable the payment of the officers and men prior to their departure from Camp Dodge.

## PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF ACCOUNTS CURRENT Section III

I. GENERAL ORDER RESCINDED: 1. General Order number 2, Hq Iowa National Guard, AGO Iowa, dated February 2, 1942 is hereby rescinded.

II. ALLOWANCES OF STATE FUNDS: 1. The following allowances of State Funds based on the appropriation as contained in Senate File 350, 50th General Assembly 1943 are announced for the information and guidance of all concerned effective July 1, 1943.

## a. OFFICER UNIFORM ALLOWANCES

(1) A single initial allowance of \$100.00 is authorized for each commissioned officer of the Iowa State Guard, by the State of Iowa, toward the purchase of necessary articles of the uniform.

(2) A seller of uniforms and uniform equipment will be required to furnish an itemized invoice, in triplicate, together with completed form No. 38, Iowa SG, in triplicate, with the approval of the officer making purchase, indorsed thereon, which will be forwarded to the Adjutant General's Office, State House, Des Moines, Iowa for payment.

(3) Articles of the uniform purchased from State Funds, will remain the property of the State of Iowa, for a period of one year from the date of purchase.

(4) The following articles of uniform are considered the minimum requirements for officers of the Iowa State Guard:

1 Cap, garrison.

1 Coat, (blouse), Dark O. D.

1 Trousers, Dark, O. D. to match coat.

1 Pair oxfords, russet.

1 Overcoat (Short).

1 Shirt, cotton, tan.

1 Trousers, cotton, tan.

1 Necktie, tan.

3 Shoulder patches, Iowa (Issue)

2 Insignia, Iowa (Issue).

Necessary insignia of grade and branch.

(Insignia of branch for all officers of the Iowa State Guard except general staff officers and Military Police will be infantry.)

(5) A uniform maintenance allowance of \$25.00 per year is authorized for each commissioned officer who has completed one year of service in the Iowa State Guard and who has satisfactorily performed appropriate duties.
(6) Claim for the Uniform Maintenance Allowance will be prepared in triplicate on form No. 38, Iowa SG, showing date of original commission in the Iowa State Guard, as: "Uniform Maintenance Allowance, original commission, Iowa State Guard, December 24, 1941."
(7) All claims for Uniform Maintenance Allowance will be submitted to the Adjutant General of Iowa, thru the Headquarters of the Iowa State Guard for payment, and will bear the approval of the Commanding General Iowa State Guard before payment is made.

#### b. HEADQUARTERS ALLOWANCE:

## (1) Organizations:

Commanding General, Iowa State Guard	\$600.00
Regimental Headquarters	\$400.00
Battalion Headquarters	\$200.00

(2) Expenditures from this allowance will be limited to purchase of stationery, not otherwise furnished, purchase of postage, payment of telephone service, official long distance telephone calls, official telegrams, and other specific expenditures which may have been authorized in writing by the Adjutant General.

#### c. PER CAPITA (drill) ALLOWANCES:

(1) Under provisions of section 467.52 Chapter 28.1 Code of Iowa 1939 as amended by the 49th General Assembly, a per capita (drill) allowance of \$4.00 per capita, computed on the average enlisted strength during each semi-annual period, will be paid to each unit commander.

Expenditures from this allowance will be confined to payment of (2)items and payment for services rendered which contribute in general to the comfort and contentment and the mental and physical improvement of the enlisted personnel or the betterment from a Military viewpoint, of the Unit as a whole. Payment of items to be used for the benefit of the entire personnel will be the only legitimate expenditures from this allowance such as, Telephone service for armories, Official long distance telephone calls, Official telegrams, postage, stationery and office supplies not furnished by the state, cartage to and from armory of military property, janitor supplies not furnished by owner or armories, athletic equipment, military text books and publications not otherwise furnished by the State of Iowa, Miscellaneous equipment for armories, labor necessary for safeguarding armories and military property. Under no consideration will funds be disbursed from this allowance for the purpose of sponsoring entertainment, dances or like social activities.

(3) Under special circumstances and subject to the prior approval of the Adjutant General, a reasonable amount may be disbursed from this allowance for the purpose of relieving a responsible officer for property lost, stolen or destroyed. Such authorization will be given only after approved report of survey has held the responsible officer pecuniarily liable for any shortage of property. No disbursement will be approved by the Adjutant General until the recommendation of the unit council has been filed. This council will be composed of two commissioned officers, other than the responsible officer, and the two senior non-commissioned officers of the unit. When there are but two commissioned officers on duty with the unit, the composition of the unit council is modified to one commissioned officer other than the responsible officer. No payments will be authorized or permitted from this allowance to reimburse officers or enlisted men for attendance at drill or range practice.

(4) Should any doubt exist as to the propriety of any purchase, a request will be directed to the Adjutant General, setting forth in detail the item or service to be purchased and the amount thereof. In such cases no purchase will be made until formal approval has been received.

(5) All payments will be made on "Voucher Checks" Form No. 14, Iowa SG, on which will be entered an itemized statement of items or services purchased or such itemized statement will be securely fastened to the voucher check issued in payment. Payments made on other types of checks will not be acceptable.

d. Clerical Compensation Allowance:

(1) Organizations:

(2) Expenditures from this Regimental Headquarters fund will be limited to compensation for clerical duties performed by Regimental Adjutants not to exceed fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per month.

(3) Expenditures from this Company and Detachment fund will be limited to compensation for clerical duties performed by the designated Company or Detachment clerk not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) per month for company clerks and not to exceed seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) per month for detachment clerks.

(4) All payments will be made on "voucher checks" Form No. 14 Iowa State Guard on which will be entered an itemized statement of period covered and services rendered and vouchers entered on accounts current.

#### III. PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF ACCOUNTS CURRENT

1. The following instructions will govern the preparation and submission of Accounts Current:

a. Accounts Current will be kept in duplicate on form No. 19, Iowa SG.

b. Entries will be made promptly at the time of receipt or disbursement of funds.

c. All Commanding Officers, who by virtue of their office are disbursing officers or custodians of State Funds, will close their Accounts Current on June 30th and December 31st of each calendar year or immediately upon being relieved from duty as custodian or disbursing officer of State Funds.

d. The original copy of Accounts Current, embodying all the prescribed data and accompanied by the cancelled Voucher Checks, issued during the period covered by the Accounts Current, will be submitted to the Adjutant General as soon as practicable at the end of each semiannual period and in no event later than twenty (20) days from the last day of the semi-annual period. The Accounts Current will also be accompanied by the Bank Statement for the last month of the semi-annual period showing the balance of State funds in the bank as of the last day of the semi-annual period and whenever this is impracticable the Accounts Current will be accompanied by a written statement submitted over the signature of one of the officers of the particular bank in which the funds are on deposit, which will show the total balance of the State Funds in the bank, as of the last day of the semi-annual period.

2. Warrants issued by the State of Iowa in payment of per capita and Headquarters allowances will be indorsed by the payee and deposited in an accredited banking institution in a single account to be known as "State Funds, Company "....." Regt. Iowa SG. Company funds or funds derived from sources other than the State of Iowa, will not be deposited in this account.

3. The lending of money from any allowance received from the State of Iowa for any purpose is prohibited.



# ANNOUNCEMENT OF CHANGE-Per Capital (drill)

Allowances Section 1

I. ANNOUNCEMENT OF CHANGE—Per Capita (drill) Allowances. 1. Paragraph 1, c, (2), Sec. II, GO No. 7 AGO Iowa, dated 9 June 1943, as pertains to expenditures from Per Capita Allowances is amended to read:

"(2) Expenditures from this allowance will be confined to payment of items and payment for services rendered which contribute in general to the comfort and contentment and the mental and physical improvement of the enlisted personnel or the betterment from a military viewpoint, of the Unit as a whole. Payment of items to be used for the benefit of the entire personnel will be the only legitimate expenditures from this allowance such as, Telephone service for armories, Official long distance calls, Official telegrams, postage, stationery and office supplies not furnished by the state, cartage to and from armory of military property, janitor supplies not furnished by owner or armories, athletic equipment, military text books and publications not otherwise furnished by the State of Iowa, miscellaneous equipment for armories, labor necessary for safeguarding armories and military property."

### REGULATIONS GOVERNING AWARD OF SERVICE BAR...... II

I. SERVICE BAR, IOWA STATE GUARD. 1. Under provisions of section 467.55, Chapter 28.1, Code of Iowa, 1939, as amended by Senate File 306, 49th General Assembly of Iowa, a service bar is established for the State Guard of Iowa.

II. REGULATIONS GOVERNING AWARD OF SERVICE BARS. 1. Service bars may be awarded to officers and enlisted men of the Iowa State Guard, upon recommendation of their immediate commanding officers, for exemplary behavior, efficiency and fidelity, who have completed one, two or more years service in the active State Guard and have attended at least sixty per cent of the regularly scheduled drills of the organization. Inactive State Guard service will not be counted in computing length of time served.

2. Blank Forms upon which to submit requisitions for Service Bars will be furnished upon request by Headquarters Iowa State Guard.
