THE EISENHOWER TROPHY

The Chief, National Guard Bureau, with the consent of General of the Army, Dwight D. Eisenhower, has established an award to be known as the "EISENHOWER TROPHY", which is to be presented after the end of each calendar year to the most outstanding company-size unit of the National Guard in each State.

The trophy, in the form of a large cup, will be engraved with the name of the winning unit and will remain in the custody of the unit during the current year. Thereafter it will be replaced with a smaller replica to remain the permanent possession of the unit.

The 34th Infantry Division Band, Fairfield, Iowa was the first unit to receive this award and the Trophy was presented on 8 December 1949.

FIELD TRAINING-ARMY NATIONAL GUARD 1948

Under the provisions of Training Authority 13A, National Guard Bureau, dated 2 August 1948, the following units, Iowa National Guard, under the Command of Major General Ray C. Fountain, attended Field Training at Fort Riley, Kansas during the period 8 to 22 August 1948.

The approval of Fort Riley as the training site for 1948 Field Training provided the first post war opportunity for the 34th Infantry Division to participate as a unit in Field Maneuvers. Training was excellent, morale was very good and it is believed that the entire 34th Division gained much needed training as a result of the facilities made available by the Regular Army Authorities.

FIELD TRAINING-AIR NATIONAL GUARD 1948

Under the provisions of Training Authority 13-1-Air, National Guard Bureau, dated 19 August 1948, the Iowa Air National Guard under the Command of Colonel Ellis E. Eno attended Field Training during the period 14-28 August 1948.

Due to the lack of facilities the Iowa Air Guard participated in training at home stations as shown:

174th Fighter Sq (SE) 174th Weather Sq (Type A) Det B, 232d Air Svc Group Utility Flight, 174th Ftr Sq Lack of a regular Air Force operational Base was a serious handicap to the Group training of the Air units. However, it is anticipated within another year a regular Air Force Base will be made available for the Field Training of the Air Guard Units.

Morale of the organization was excellent and every effort was made by all personnel to take full advantage of the limited training facilities available.

FIELD TRAINING-ARMY NATIONAL GUARD 1949

Under the provisions of Training Authority No. 13, National Guard Bureau, dated 26 July 1951, the following units, Iowa National Guard under the Command of Major General Ray C. Fountain, attended Field Training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, during the period 7-21 August 1949.

Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri proved to be nearly ideal as a training ground for the 34th Infantry Division, geographically well located to both Iowa and Nebraska. Training facilities were very good and housing accommodations well located and in fair condition.

Training showed much improvement over 1948 and percentage of attendance was much higher (85%). It is hoped that Fort Leonard

Wood will again be available as a training site and that the Iowa National Guard can again show a decided improvement over previous years.

FIELD TRAINING-IOWA AIR NATIONAL GUARD 1949

Under the provisions of Training Authority 13-1-Air-50, National Guard Bureau, dated 2 August 1949, the following units, Iowa Air National Guard attended Field Training at Camp Williams, Camp Douglas, Wisconsin during the period 14-28 August 1949.

With the selection of Camp Williams, Camp Douglas, Wisconsin as the Field Training site for 1949, the Air units had the first opportunity to operate properly as a complete tactical organization, every effort was made by all personnel to take advantage of this situation and a highly successful Field Training period was the result.

Pilot training advanced rapidly and at the close of Training favorable comment was received from the Air Force inspection teams.

133D AIRCRAFT CONTROL AND WARNING SQUADRON

The 133d AC&W Squadron which was organized too late during 1948 (1 June 1949) to participate in Field Training during that year, was ordered to attend Field Training at Camp Dodge, Iowa during the period 14-28 August 1949.

Although this was the first Field Training for this unit reports indicate that the unit, under the Command of Major John F. Monaghan, very capably handled their assigned training problems and the personnel gained valuable experience in operating radar equipment under tactical conditions.

SIOUX CITY PACKING PLANT EXPLOSION

On 14 December 1949 the Swift and Company packing plant, Sioux City, Iowa, was shattered by an explosion which destroyed a large section of the main plant. Fortunately the explosion occurred during the noon hour and a major portion of the employees were out of the building.

Units of the Iowa National Guard from Sioux City were immediately called to assist in rescue operations and to aid in protection of the property. Credit to individual members of the Iowa National Guard and the moral obligations felt by members of the Guard are reflected by the fact that large numbers volunteered services and reported for duty before any call was forwarded to the units.

- a. Headquarters Allowance for each organization is payable semiannually in advance. This allowance will normally be distributed to organizations between the 15th and 31st of January and July of each year.
- b. Expenditures from this allowance are limited to the purchase of stationary and office supplies not otherwise furnished, postage, telephone service, including official long distance telephone tolls, official telegrams, and any other specific purposes authorized in writing in advance by The Adjutant General of Iowa.
- c. All disbursements from this fund will be made by voucher check (Form 111 AGO Iowa) provided by this office, on which must be itemized the articles or services purchased. It is permissable to attach the vendor's itemized statement to the cancelled voucher check, making reference to such attached itemized statement.

2. Per Capita (Drill) Allowance

Under the provisions of Section 29.52, Code of Iowa, 1947, a Per Capita (Drill) allowance of Four Dollars (\$4.00) per capita, computed on the basis of the average enlisted strength during each semi-annual period, will be provided each company, troop, battery, or detachment commander. This allowance will normally be paid between the 15th and 31st of January and July of each year.

a. Expenditures from this allowance will be restricted to the purchase of articles and payment of services which contribute to the welfare, comfort, contentment and mental and physical improvement of the enlisted personnel or the military efficiency of the unit. Disbursements from this allowance will be restricted to:

Cartage of military stores, supplies and equipment, when necessary. Athletic equipment.

Club room fixtures.

Military text books not issued.

Payment for supplies and services which would ordinarily be paid from other allowances, when such allowances are not adequate, but only upon the prior, written approval of the Adjutant General of Iowa. A reasonable amount may be disbursed from this allowance for the purpose of relieving a responsible officer for property lost, stolen or destroyed for which such officer is held pecunarily liable on approved Report of Survey. The specific written approval of the Company Council and the written authority of The Adjutant General of Iowa shall be obtained before such disbursement may be made. The Company Council shall be composed of two commissioned officers of the unit, other than the responsible officer, and the two senior noncommissioned officers. When there are but two officers assigned to a unit, the Company Council may be composed of one commissioned officer, other than the responsible officer, and the two senior noncommissioned officers. Payment of the annual premium of the bond of the C. O. should be made from this allowance.

Disbursements from this allowance for entertainment, refreshments, social activities, dances, or flowers for Funerals, are prohibited.

Any unauthorized expenditures will be disallowed and the unit commander will be required to reimburse the allowance from personal or other funds in the amount of the disallowance.

Overdrafts on this allowance are not authorized.

All non-expendable property purchased from this allowance will be carried on the records of the State Quartermaster as State Property, and organization Commanders shall be responsible for such items to the same extent they are responsible for non expendable items of Federal Property.

All disbursements from this fund will be made by voucher check (Form 111 AGO Iowa) provided by this office, on which must be itemized the articles or services purchased. It is permissible to attach the vendor's itemized statement to the cancelled voucher check, making reference to such attached itemized statement.

SECTION III. ACCOUNTING FOR STATE FUNDS.

Each officer receiving State Fund will maintain a work sheet on which will be entered all receipts and disbursements. Form 112 AGO lowa (buff) will be used for this work sheet. All receipts and disbursements of State Funds will be entered currently.

Approximately thirty(30) days prior to the end of each accounting period, each unit commander receiving State Funds will be provided with an Account Current (Form 112 AGO Iowa (White) upon which will be entered the balance of State Funds in each account at the beginning of the accounting period and State Funds received during the accounting period. This form will be completed by each unit commander, to indicate the expenditures and the balance on hand as of the final date of the accounting period. Completed Accounts Current, accompanied by bank statements and cancelled voucher checks, will be transmitted in duplicate to The Adjutant General of Iowa, not later than the 15th day of the month following the close of each accounting period.

Each unit commander receiving State Funds will be responsible that Accounts Current are submitted promptly as provided herein. No State Allowance will be distributed to any organization until an Account Current for the preceding period has been submitted and cleared.

Warrents issued by the State of Iowa in payment of any State Allowance shall be endorsed by the payee and deposited in an accred-

ited banking institution in a single fund to be known as "State funds, Company th Inf, Iowa NG", or as the case may be, Company funds, unit funds or funds derived from sources other than the State of Iowa shall not be deposited in this account.

The lending of money from any of the allowances received from the

State of Iowa is prohibited.
