

**TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR OF IOWA AND
COMMANDER IN CHIEF OF THE IOWA
NATIONAL GUARD (Army and Air)**

The Biennial Report of the Adjutant General of Iowa, for the period 1 July 1956 through 30 June 1958, is respectfully submitted.

This report summarizes the major activities of the Iowa National Guard (Army and Air) for the indicated period. A discussion of subjects common to both Army and Air National Guard is followed by separate sections devoted to the activities of each.

The Adjutant General's Department reviews the indicated biennium with a certain amount of satisfaction. Numerical strength is at an all time high, the status training is progressing excellently, and many new missions have been completed or are well underway. It is the firm conviction that both the National Government and the State are receiving a tremendous return on every dollar invested in the Iowa National Guard.

As Annexes the Report includes all General Orders published, list of all Adjutants General who have served the state of Iowa, Active, Inactive and Retired Officers, and Graves Registration reports.

INTRODUCTION

The National Guard is an organization composed of individuals voluntarily serving the States and the Nation as members of military units. The tradition of the citizen-soldier goes back to colonial days when every adult male was assigned to a militia company. Those companies which were active were called "Volunteer Militia" and were equipped and trained according to the needs of the time. The National Guard is the lineal descendent of the Volunteer Militia. The equipment of the militia was meager and training was limited to drill—but regular drill was required. Then, as now, the emphasis was on training, on readiness for any emergency.

The National Guard of today is organized under Regular Army and Air Force tables of organization and equipment. It consists of 27 divisions in the Army National Guard and 27 wings in the Air National Guard, and, in addition, a number of regimental combat teams, anti-aircraft artillery battalions, and other combat and support units. On 30 June 1958 the National Guard consisted of 5,900 federally recognized units with a strength of 464,324. These units and personnel are located in approximately 2,500 cities and towns throughout the 48 States and in the Territories of Hawaii and Alaska, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia.

The National Guard of the several States has a dual status and mission. Each federally recognized unit is also a part of the National Guard of the United States. The mission of the National Guard of the several States is to provide organizations in each State, so trained and equipped as to enable them to function efficiently at existing strength in the protection of life and property and the preservation of peace, order, and public safety, under competent orders of the State authorities. When not on active duty in the service of the United States, members of the National Guard of the United States are administered, armed, uniformed, equipped, and trained in their status as members of the National Guard or Air National Guard of the several States and Territories, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia.

The mission of the National Guard of the United States is to provide units of the reserve components of the Army and the Air Force, adequately organized, trained, and equipped, available for mobilization in the event of a national emergency or war, in accordance with the deployment schedule, and capable of participating in combat operations, in support of Department of Defense war plans.

The National Guard Bureau is charged with administering approved Department of the Army and Department of the Air Force policies other than those relative to training, for the Army National Guard and the Air National Guard not in active Federal service, and with promulgating Department of the Army and Department of the Air Force directives and regulations applicable to the Army National Guard and the Air National Guard, including those relating to training.

This Biennial Report is a summary of the Iowa National Guard's major accomplishments and activities, and the achievements and problems of the Military Department of the State of Iowa, during the biennium ending 30 June 1958.

POLICIES OF DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY AND DEPARTMENT OF THE AIR FORCE RELATING TO THE NATIONAL GUARD

I. GENERAL

The National Guard of the United States and the Air National Guard of the United States are integral parts and first line reserve components of the Army of the United States and the United States Air Force. The National Guard of the United States, in time of national emergency, may be called or ordered into the Army of the United States and the United States Air Force through its National Guard of the United States status. All federally recognized units and elements of the active National Guard and the personnel of the Inactive National Guard of the several states, territories, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, together, constitutes the National Guard of the United States.

II. MISSIONS

A. Mission of the National Guard of the United States and the policy relative to its employment are set forth in the Armed Forces Reserve Act of 1952 (Public Law 476, 82d Congress) as follows:

"Sec. 201. (a) The Congress hereby declares that the reserve components of the Armed Forces of the United States are maintained for the purpose of providing trained units and qualified individuals to be available for active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States in time of War or national emergency, and at such other times as the national security may require, to meet the requirements of the Armed Forces of the United States in excess of those of the Regular components thereof, during and after the period needed for procurement and training of additional trained units and qualified individuals to achieve the planned mobilization."

This law specifically defined and further clarified dictates that the mission of the National Guard of the United States is to provide a reserve component of the Army of the United States and the United States Air Force capable of immediate expansion to war strength, able to furnish units fit for service anywhere in the world, trained and equipped to: 1. Defend critical areas of the United States against land, seaborne or airborne invasion. 2. Assist in covering the mobilization and concentration of the remainder of the reserve forces. 3. Participate by units in all types of operations, including the offensive, either in the United States or overseas.

B. Mission of the National Guard of the Several States.

A dual mission is levied upon both the Army and Air National Guard. As stated above, both the Army and Air National Guard have the Federal mission of preparing their units and members for active military service in time of national emergency, however, there is also an important mission to perform for the State of Iowa. The State mission, a peacetime one, is the traditional guardian of life and property and constitutes a State security Force, which provides sufficient organization in the State so trained and equipped as to enable them to function efficiently at existing strength in the protection of life and property and the preservation of peace, order and public safety under competent orders of State authorities. This mission also is being accomplished. (See "Active State Duty" hereafter for incidents requiring use of State Troops during this biennum.)

III. COMPOSITION OF THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD

A. The organization and units allotted to the several States will be those which are required for the accomplishments of the mission of the National Guard and, when taken with the units of the Regular Army, United States Air Force and their reserve components, will provide the

essential forces required for early mobilization. Within the total allotment, organizations of the proper type will be allotted to each State to enable it to accomplish the Federal and State missions.

IV. FEDERAL AND STATE RESPONSIBILITY

A. GENERAL

The National Guard is an integral part of the Army of the United States and the United States Air Force and its success depends upon mutual confidence between the Federal Government and the States and Territories. Such confidence is obtained only by the wholehearted efforts of all parties to maintain an effective National Guard.

B. The Federal Government is responsible for:

1. Providing the pay of federally recognized personnel for participation in authorized inactive duty training and active duty for training, including appropriate duty or duties and periods of equivalent duty or training, and Administrative pay.
2. The procurement and issue of uniforms, arms, equipment and supplies.
3. The supervision of training.
4. To appropriate a sum of money annually for the expense of providing ordnance stores, quartermaster stores, camp equipment and to contribute to State Funds an equitable share of the expense of construction and maintenance of certain training facilities, as are now or may later be authorized by law.
5. Audit and inspect National Guard Units, Army and Air, and accounts and records of the United States Property and Fiscal Officer.

C. The State Government is responsible for:

1. Subject to such qualifications for Federal recognition as may be established by the Secretary of the Army and Air Force, appoint, promote, transfer, assign and separate personnel of the National Guard, Army and Air.
2. Provide training and storage facilities, except as contributed by the Federal Government.
3. To train officers, warrant officers and enlisted personnel of the National Guard, Army and Air.
4. To properly account for and maintain all Federal property and funds.

D. Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment Iowa National Guard.

Within each state there shall be an administrative staff to be designated as "State Headquarters and Headquarter Detachment" and which will be organized and federally recognized as a unit of the National Guard. The numbers and grades of officers, warrant officers and enlisted men within the State Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment will be based upon the strength of allotted National Guard Units to the State and, in addition, will provide a suitable number of officers and enlisted men for duties in connection with Selective Service and internal security.

E. Headquarters, Iowa Air National Guard.

By direction of the Secretary of the Air Force through the Chief, National Guard Bureau, the unit known as the Headquarters Iowa Air National Guard is assigned to the office of the State Adjutant General. As the State Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, the strength of the Headquarters, Iowa Air National Guard, is based upon the total personnel authorization of the Federally recognized Air National Guard units of the State. The responsibility of determining positions and titles for the grade authorized rests with the State Adjutant General. The Mission of Headquarters, Iowa Air National Guard, is to advise and assist the Adjutant General in matters pertaining to administration, logistics and training of the National Guard Units within the State.

F. Advisors.


Under policies of the Department of the Army and Department of the Air Force, selection and assignment of qualified advisors is reserved as a function of Headquarters, Department of the Army and Headquarters, Department of the Air Force. The supervision of the training responsibility of the advisors is vested in The Chief, Army Field Forces and Chief of Reserve Forces, Headquarters, United States Air Force. Personnel on duty as advisors with the National Guard will have no command status with troops or units of the National Guard, nor will they be subject to orders of State military authorities. The primary duties of advisors will be to advise and assist responsible commanders in the attainment and maintenance of that State of efficiency of the National Guard units as is prescribed by Headquarters, Department of the Army and Headquarters, Department of the Air Force.

G. National Guard Bureau.

1. The National Guard Bureau is charged with:
 - a. Administering approved joint Army and Air Force policies, other than those relative to training, when such policies are applicable to both the Army National Guard not in the Federal service and the Air National Guard not in the Federal service and with promulgating joint Army-Air Force directives applicable to both the Army and Air National Guard, including those relating to training.
 - b. Functioning as the channel of communication between the Departments of the Army and Air Force and the State on all matters pertaining to the Army and Air National Guard.
 - c. Maintaining an office of record of all Department of the Army and Air Force records pertaining to the Army and Air National Guard not in the Federal service.

H. National Guard Policy Making.

All policies affecting the National Guard are prepared by the General Staff Committee on National Guard Policy (known as the "Section Five Committee") for action by the Secretary of the Army and Secretary of the Air Force under normal Department of the Army and Department of the Air Force Procedure. All regulations to carry such policies into effect are reviewed by this committee.



MILITARY DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE OF IOWA

Section 29.2, Code of Iowa, 1954, creates the Iowa National Guard and the Iowa Air National Guard, and Section 29.6 provides that the Military Forces of the State of Iowa shall consist of the National Guard and the Militia.

National Guard Regulations, published by the Department of the Army, and Air National Guard Regulations, published by the Department of the Air Force, provide that the National Guard of the United States and the Air National Guard of the United States, civilian components of the Army of the United States and the United States Air Force, shall consist of Federally recognized units of the National Guard and the Air National Guard, and as such are subject to federal law and regulations.

Section 29.7, Code of Iowa, 1954, provides that the Governor shall be the Commander in Chief of the Military Forces of the State, except so much of the Army National Guard and/or Air National Guard as may be in federal service, and as such may employ the same for the defense or relief of the State, the enforcement of its laws and the protection of life and property therein.

Section 29.12, Code of Iowa, 1954, provides that the Adjutant General shall have control of the Military Department of the State and perform such duties as pertain to the office of the Adjutant General under federal laws and regulations. Paragraph 35, National Guard Regulations Number 1, published by the Department of the Army and Air Force, provides that the office of the State Adjutant General is a State Office administered under the Governor of the State, and that the State Adjutant General is the agency through whom instructions are issued to the National Guard of the State by Federal Military Authorities.

THE ADJUTANT GENERAL OF IOWA

Section 29.11 and 29.12, Code of Iowa, 1954, provide for the appointment and qualifications of the Adjutant General of the State and further provides that the Adjutant General shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- (1) The Adjutant General shall have charge of the State Military Reservations, and all other property of the State kept or used for military purposes.
- (2) The Adjutant General of Iowa is the principal assistant and advisor to the Governor on all matters pertaining to the Military Forces of the State of Iowa.
- (3) He transmits the decisions of the Commander in Chief to appropriate staff officers for preparation of necessary orders, or transmits them in the form of orders to those who execute them.
- (4) He is the principal coordinating agency of the command.
- (5) He formulates and announces policies for the operation of the Staff and for the administration, operation and training of the Military Forces of the State of Iowa.
- (6) He advises and informs the Governor relative to the administration, operations, training and general effectiveness of the command.
- (7) He represents the Commander in Chief when duly authorized to do so.
- (8) He observes and supervises the execution of authorized orders.

(9) Publications of federal military authorities are supplied to the National Guard through the Adjutant General.

(10) The Adjutant General is responsible to Federal Military Authorities for the preparation and submission of reports and returns to the Chief of the National Guard Bureau as directed.

(11) The Adjutant General is charged with the responsibility for maintaining the Office of Records for the Iowa National Guard. The office of the Adjutant General processes all correspondence as provided in Section IX, NGR 1 and AR 340-15. The safeguarding of classified military information and the classification of military documents will be the responsibility of the Adjutant General.

(12) The Adjutant General is responsible for authentication, publication and distribution of all orders, circulars and memoranda; the operation of the Headquarters messages center to include postal service, establishment and supervision of administrative procedures, classifications, assignment, reclassification, reassignment, promotion, transfer, retirement and discharge of all individuals of the Iowa National Guard within the policies established by Federal Military Authorities and the Governor of Iowa; decorations, citations honors and awards.

(13) The Adjutant General is responsible for the supervision of and formulation of policies pertaining to all civilian personnel employed by the Military Department of the State of Iowa, and personnel employed pursuant to the Civilian Personnel Program (Army & Air) supported with federal funds.

(14) The Adjutant General is responsible for the custody and maintenance of all property and funds, Federal and State, provided for the use of the Iowa National Guard, and for all installations within the State of Iowa utilized for military purposes.

(15) Upon receipt from the Chief, National Guard Bureau of notification of Federal funds apportioned to the State of Iowa under the approved program of expenditures, the Adjutant General will request, by letter, that the Chief, National Guard Bureau, allot the funds apportioned for the approved projects for which the State may obligate funds.


ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL OF IOWA

Section 29.12, Code of Iowa, 1954, provides that the Assistant Adjutant General shall serve in the office of the Adjutant General and aid him by performing such duties as the Adjutant General may assign him. In the absence or disability of the Adjutant General he shall perform the duties of that office as Acting Adjutant General.

U. S. PROPERTY AND FISCAL OFFICER

The United States Property & Fiscal Officer is an Iowa National Guard Officer, assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, Iowa National Guard, on active federal duty and paid from federal funds. In accordance with the provisions of Section 29.18, Code of Iowa, 1954, and appropriate federal regulations, he is appointed by the Governor of Iowa upon the recommendation of the Adjutant General, subject to the approval of the Secretary of Defense.

Public Law 477, 83rd Congress, amended Section 67 of the National Defense Act and changed the designation of the Acting United States Property and Disbursing Officer to United States Property and Fiscal Officer.

The USP&FO for Iowa is responsible to the Adjutant General of Iowa and to the Chief, National Guard Bureau, for the direction and coordination of activities relating to the storage, issue, distribution, maintenance, repair, and salvage of all federally owned supplies and equipment assigned to the Iowa National Guard, and as State Quartermaster he is responsible to the Adjutant General for all state owned military supplies and equipment utilized by the Military Forces of the State of Iowa.

He is the accountable officer for all federally owned property, both Army and Air Force.

He functions as transportation officer (not to include operation of organic National Guard vehicular transportation) and as Fiscal Officer (for federal funds only).

He is responsible to the Adjutant General of Iowa for the supervision and execution of arrangements for supply evacuation, transportation and other administrative matters related thereto, and for recommendations as to necessary decisions concerning supply evacuation and transportation.

The facilities of the USP&FO consist of approximately 40,000 square feet of warehousing and 9500 square feet of office space located at Camp Dodge. Under a service contract, the Department of Defense reimburses the State of Iowa for 75% of the maintenance and operational costs of the facility.

The USP&FO activity employs thirty-six (36) accounting and clerical personnel in the offices and warehouses, all of whom are employed pursuant to the National Guard Technician Program supported entirely with federal funds.

STATE MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES

Maintenance of equipment issued to the Iowa National Guard is a vital and continuing function of the Military Department of the State. Military maintenance is defined as "action taken to keep material in a serviceable condition or to restore it to serviceability when it is unserviceable." Thus maintenance of material includes inspecting, testing, servicing, classifying as to serviceability, repairing, rebuilding and reclaiming.

The State Maintenance Officer is a full time civilian employee who is also an Iowa National Guard officer assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, Iowa National Guard. He is employed pursuant to the Civilian Personnel Program, with an NGC classification, supported entirely with federal funds.

The State Maintenance Officer is the technical advisor to the Adjutant General of Iowa and to the United States Property & Fiscal Officer on all matters pertaining to maintenance of supplies and equipment, including Army National Guard aviation.

The Military Department of the State of Iowa maintenance activities, under the control and supervision of the State Maintenance Officer, include the following:

1. National Guard Maintenance Shop:

The State Maintenance Shop is a field maintenance facility, equipped with personnel, tools, test equipment and shop equipment for repairing and servicing of material of all technical services. The Maintenance Shop occupies (39 technicians employed) the following facilities located at Camp Dodge:

Buildings #7 and 8—approximately 44,195 square feet.

2. Concentration Site:

Concentration Sites are established for the storage and maintenance of unit T/E equipment which is not essential at unit garrisons for training purposes, in order to effect savings in transportation and assure more efficient and economical maintenance. The Concentration Site in Iowa is located at Camp Dodge and occupies the following facilities:

Building Number 7A, approximately 34,776 square feet.

Buildings Number 59 and 85 are used for storage of vehicles, approximately 16,120 square feet.

Seven (7) technicians are employed.

3. Army Aviation Maintenance Pool:

Liaison type aircraft assigned to the Army National Guard are based at the Army Aviation Maintenance Pool, under the control and supervision of the State Maintenance Officer, located at the Boone Municipal Airport in Boone, Iowa. The Pool facilities consist of a hangar, office and storage facilities, parachute rooms, maintenance shop and fuel storage facilities, adequate for approximately eighteen (18) liaison type army aircraft. Eight (8) technicians are employed at the Pool, with NGM classifications, entirely supported by federal funds.

4. Service Centers:

Service Centers, sub-shops of the main State Maintenance Shop at Camp Dodge, have been located at the following Iowa National Guard Garrisons for the purpose of more economical operation of the State maintenance functions:

Davenport, Iowa City, Fairfield, Oskaloosa, Corning, Council Bluffs, Sioux City, Cherokee, Fort Dodge, and Waterloo. A total of thirteen (13) mechanics, with NGM classifications, supported with federal funds, are assigned duty stations at the service centers.



LEGISLATION

STATE:

The 57th General Assembly of the Iowa Legislature, which convened January 14th, 1957, enacted S. F. 457 (Departmental appropriations), Section 48 thereof providing as follows,

"For the National Guard and State Guard there is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the State for each year of the biennium beginning July 1st, 1957, and ending June 30, 1959, the sum of seven hundred two thousand five hundred twenty dollars (\$702,520.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary * * *."

The 57th General Assembly further enacted S. F. 474, an Act to appropriate from the General Fund of the State of Iowa to the National Guard and State Guard the sum of two hundred fifty two thousand five hundred dollars (\$252,500.00) to be used in the following manner:

For the State's share of the armory construction program made available to the State by the Federal Government for the acquisition, construction, expansion, rehabilitation and converting facilities of the administration and training units of the National Guard and the State Guard.....\$145,000.00

For repairs, replacements, alterations, equipment, and rehabilitation of armories in connection with which federal funds may be accepted 40,000.00

For repairs, replacements, alterations, equipment, and rehabilitation of grounds, buildings and roads at Camp Dodge, Iowa 67,500.00

FEDERAL—1957:

The Congress of the United States enacted several bills directly affecting the National Guard during fiscal year 1957. Of major general importance were the following:

Public Law 639, 84th Congress, was the Department of Defense Appropriation bill for fiscal year 1957.

Public Law 665, 84th Congress, amended the Universal Military Training and Service Act of 1951 to authorize jurisdiction in the Federal Courts in certain reemployment cases, including those involving reservists ordered to training duty.

Public Law 737, 84th Congress, the Armed Forces Regular Officer Augmentation Act of 1956, increased the authorization for the Regular officer strength of the Army and the Air Force in an effort to bring about greater career opportunities for officers currently serving in a Reserve status.

Public Law 845, 84th Congress, authorized female reserve officers of the Army or Air Force appointed as nurses or women medical specialists to be members of the Army or Air National Guard of the United States.

Public Law 881, 84th Congress, the Servicemen's and Veterans' Survivor Benefits Act of 1956, amended existing laws relating to the military veterans' benefits, and the social security system.

Public Law 1028, 84th Congress, revised, codified, and enacted into law Title 10 of the United States Code, entitled "Armed Forces," and Title 32 of the United States Code, entitled "National Guard."

A number of bills of importance to the National Guard were still pending in Congress on 30 June 1957. Among these were the following:

H. R. 3041, 85th Congress, a bill to amend section 302 of the Career Compensation Act of 1949 and section 7 of the Dependents Assistance Act of 1950 to authorize the payment of a basic allowance for quarters to an enlisted member of a reserve component on active duty for training as if he were a member of a regular component of a uniformed service.

H. R. 5807, 85th Congress, a bill to amend and make permanent the Missing Persons Act. Among other things, this bill would extend coverage to members of the reserve components while they are performing full-time training duty, other full-time duty, and inactive duty training with or without pay. Members of the reserve components entering a missing status while performing duty of the types enumerated would have credited to their pay accounts the same pay and allowances that they would receive if they were performing full-time active duty. This bill is intended to treat reservists who participate in training without pay, such as weekend proficiency flights in aircraft, as if they were on active duty when they enter a missing status (signed into law 29 August 1957 as Public Law 85-217, 85th Congress).

H. H. 6296, 85th Congress, a bill to permit nonprior servicemen to enlist in the National Guard for two to six years and prior servicemen from one to six years, with reenlistments authorized for between one and six years. Those who served in one of the highest three enlisted grades could enlist for an indefinite period on a career basis. The bill would also provide for involuntary extension of enlistments by Presidential proclamation in an emergency declared by Congress.

H. R. 6297, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for the statutory organization of the National Guard Bureau.

H. R. 6299, 85th Congress, a bill relating to withholding sums for State employee retirement, disability, and death benefit system purposes from the compensation of certain civilian employees of the National Guard.

H. R. 6431, 85th Congress, a bill to amend Title 10 and Title 32 of the United States Code to provide benefits for nonregular members of the Armed Forces and members of the National Guard who become disabled as a result of disease incurred while performing training duty.

H. R. 6600, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for the training of State defense forces and the issuance of arms, ammunition, clothing, and other items of military equipment to them at Federal expense, with administration of the bill's provisions charged to the Chief, National Guard Bureau.

H. R. 6601, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for the appointment, designation, or detail of United States Property and Fiscal Officers.

H. R. 7697, 85th Congress, a bill to continue the plan initiated under Public Law 783, 81st Congress, for a coordinated, long range armory and other facility construction program for all civilian components of the Armed Forces. This plan contemplates the combined efforts of the Federal Government and the States and continues the concept of maximum joint utilization of armories and other facilities by the various civilian component organizations (signed into law 29 August 1957 as Public Law 85-215, 85th Congress).

H. R. 7814, 85th Congress, a bill to provide benefits for members of reserve components of the Armed Forces who become disabled as a result of disease incurred or aggravated while on active duty for training after 1 October 1949.

H. R. 8522, 85th Congress, a bill to amend the existing reemployment provisions of the Armed Forces Reserve Act of 1952 and the universal Military Training and Service Act by adding certain rights and by clarifying certain other existing rights to give National Guardsmen who perform an initial period of from three to six months active duty for training the same reemployment rights as those of ready reservists who perform similar training.

H. R. 8775, 85th Congress, a bill to remove the limitation imposed by section 709 of Title 32, United States Code, in the number and military grade of civilian employees (caretakers) that may be employed for National Guard maintenance and storage pools.

H. R. 8776, 85th Congress, a bill to amend Title 32, United States Code, with respect to the system of courts-martial for National Guardsmen not in Federal service,

H. R. 8778, 85th Congress, a bill to extend the Federal Tort Claims Act to civilian employees of the National Guard who are paid from Federal funds.

H. R. 8779, 85th Congress, a bill to amend the Career Compensation Act of 1949 to equalize the treatment of reserve and regular Army and Air Force personnel in the payment of per diem.

H. R. 8780, 85th Congress, a bill to amend the Career Compensation Act of 1949 to authorize reserve component officers to combine service in more than one reserve component in computing the four years of satisfactory Federal service necessary to qualify for the uniform maintenance allowance.

1958:

Several bills directly affecting the National Guard were enacted into law during fiscal year 1958. Of major, general importance were the following:

Public Law 85-117, 85th Congress, was the Department of Defense Appropriation for fiscal year 1958.

Public Law 85-215, 85th Congress, amended the National Defense Facilities Act of 1950, amended (50 United States Code 882), to continue the plan for coordinated, long range armory and other facility construction program for all civilian components of the Armed Forces. This plan contemplates the combined efforts of the Federal Government and the States and continues the concept of maximum joint utilization of armories and other facilities by the various civilian component organizations.

Public Law 85-217, 85th Congress, amended and made permanent the Missing Persons Act. Among other things, it extended coverage to members of the Reserve components while they are performing full-time training duty, other full-time duty, and inactive duty training. Members of the Reserve components entering a missing status while performing duty of the types enumerated would have credited to their pay accounts the same pay and allowances that they would receive if they were performing full-time active duty. This amendment is intended to treat reservists who participate in training without pay, such as weekend proficiency flights in aircraft, as if they were on active duty when they enter a missing status.

Public Law 85-270, 85th Congress, provided that the commanding general of the militia of the District of Columbia shall hold the rank of brigadier general or major general.

Public Law 85-422, 85th Congress, the Armed Forces Salary Increase Act of 1958, amended the Career Compensation Act of 1949 to adjust the method of computing basic pay for officers and enlisted members of the uniformed services, to provide proficiency pay for enlisted members thereof, and for other purposes.

A number of bills of importance to the National Guard were still pending in Congress on 30 June 1958. Among these were the following:

S. 3032, 85th Congress, a bill to extend the coverage of the Federal Tort Claim Act and section 2733 of Title 10, United States Code, to include members of the National Guard performing training or other duty authorized by Federal law, and civilian employees of the National Guard employed under authority of Section 709 of Title 32, United States Code.

The liability of the Federal Government to third persons for acts of such individuals would be identical to its present liability for acts of members of the active Army and Air Force, the Army Reserve and Air Force Reserve performing training duty, and civilian employees of the military department.

S. 3882, 85th Congress, a bill to permit the Secretary of the Army to furnish headstones or markers for unmarked graves of members of the Army National Guard or the Air National Guard, whose death occurred under honorable conditions incident to service on behalf of the United States (approved 28 August 1958 as Public Law 85-811, 85th Congress).

S. 3240 and H. R. 12304, 85th Congress, identical bills to permit the retention of Air National Guard and Army National Guard United States Property and Fiscal Officers until age 60.

H. R. 6296, 85th Congress, a bill to provide a flexible enlistment program in the National Guard. This bill would permit nonprior service personnel to enlist in the National Guard for 2 to 6 years and prior service personnel for a period of 1 year. Reenlistment of from 1 to 6 years would be permitted, except that individuals whose last service was in one of the highest three enlisted grades could reenlist for an indefinite period on a career basis. All persons enlisting in the National Guard would enlist for a corresponding period as reserves of the Army or Air Force. The bill also would provide for involuntary extension of enlistments by Presidential proclamation in the event of an emergency declared by Congress.

H. R. 6297, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for the statutory organization of the National Guard Bureau.

H. R. 6299, 85th Congress, a bill relating to withholding for State employee retirement, disability, and death benefit system purposes, on the compensation of certain civilian employees of the National Guard.

H. R. 6600, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for the training of State defense forces and the issuance of arms, ammunition, clothing and other items of military equipment to them at Federal expense. Administration of this bill's provisions would be charged to the Chief, National Guard Bureau.

H. R. 6601, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for the appointment, designation, and detail of United States Property and Fiscal Officers.

H. R. 7814, 85th Congress, a bill to provide benefits for members of Reserve components of the Armed Forces disabled from disease incurred or aggravated while on active duty for training after 1 October 1949.

H. R. 8522, 85th Congress, a bill to amend the reemployment provisions of the Armed Forces Reserve Act of 1952 and the Universal Military Training and Service Act to add certain rights and to clarify certain existing rights. At present, National Guardsmen who perform initial periods of from 3 to 6 months active duty for training have reemployment rights inferior to those of other ready reservists who perform the same training.

H. R. 8775, 85th Congress, a bill to remove the requirements that no more than 15 National Guard civilian caretakers and only 1 National Guard officer below the grade of major may be employed at a single maintenance or storage pool.

H. R. 8776, 85th Congress, a bill to modernize and clarify sections 326-333 of Title 32, United States Code, with respect to a system of courts-martial for the National Guard not in Federal service. This bill would permit the States to adopt their own codes of military justice.

H. R. 8779, 85th Congress, a bill to amend section 303 (c) of the Career Compensation Act of 1949 by providing that the term "permanent station" may also include the home of a member upon order or call to or relief from active duty, active duty for training, or full-time duty performed under the provisions of sections 316, 502, 503, 504 or 505 of Title 32, United States Code.

H. R. 8780, 85th Congress, a bill to amend the Career Compensation Act of 1949 to authorize Reserve officers to combine service in more than one Reserve component in computing the 4 years of satisfactory Federal service necessary to qualify for the uniform maintenance allowance.

H. R. 8781, 85th Congress, a bill to amend section 501(a) of the Career Compensation Act of 1949 to make applicable to officers and warrant officers of the Reserve components the authority to provide rations in kind to personnel on inactive duty training when the duty period or periods total 8 hours or more in any one calendar day.

H. R. 8782, 85th Congress, a bill to provide travel and transportation allowances for members of the National Guard when travel is performed in an inactive duty training status in compliance with Federal directives.

H. R. 8943, 85th Congress, a bill to amend Title 10, Title 14 and Title 32, United States Code, to codify recent military law and to improve the Code (approved 2 September 1958, Public Law 85-861, 85th Congress).

H. R. 9628, 85th Congress, a bill to exempt the cost-of-living allowances paid to certain caretakers and clerks employed by the National Guard outside the continental United States from income tax in the same manner as are similar allowances paid civilian officers and employees of the Federal Government stationed outside the continental United States.

H. R. 9700, 85th Congress, a bill to consolidate into one act all of the laws administered by the Veterans' Administration (approved 2 September 1958, Public Law 85-857, 85th Congress).

H. R. 12305, 85th Congress, a bill to permit the Secretaries of the Army and the Air Force to authorize members of the National Guard to perform training or duty with or without pay, in addition to the drills, annual training, service schools or other type of training or duty now permitted under sections 316, 502, 503, 504 and 505 of Title 32, United States Code. This bill also would authorize members of the National Guard not in active Federal service to conduct and instruct at service schools, and to attend such schools, under regulations prescribed by service secretaries.

H. R. 12541, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for reorganization of the Department of Defense. Among other purposes, this bill would amend section 3015 of Title 10, United States Code, to include a new subsection (a) to make the National Guard Bureau of the Department of the Army and the Department of the Air Force, headed by a chief who is advisor to the Army Chief of Staff and the Air Force Chief of Staff on National Guard matters. The new sub-section also would designate the National Guard Bureau as the channel of communication between the departments concerned and the several States, Territories, Puerto Rico, the Canal Zone, and the District of Columbia on all matters pertaining to the National Guard, the Army National Guard of the United States, and the Air National Guard of the United States (approved 6 August 1958 as Public Law 85-599, 85th Cong.).

H. R. 13374, 85th Congress, a bill to provide for the retention of deferment or exemption from training and service under the Universal Military Training and Service Act upon change of membership in a Reserve component, Army National Guard or Air National Guard (approved 21 August 1958 as Public Law 85-722, 85th Congress).

H. R. 13489, 85th Congress, a bill to provide appropriations for military construction for the Department of Defense, including the National Guard, for fiscal year 1959 (approved 28 August 1958 as Public Law 85-852, 85th Congress).

H. R. 13666, 85th Congress, a bill to remove the legal requirements that the Adjutant General of Puerto Rico shall be appointed by the President. This bill would permit the Governor of Puerto Rico to appoint the Adjutant General of the Commonwealth as provided by the laws of Puerto Rico (approved 2 September 1958 as Public Law 85-894, 85th Congress).

FEDERAL PAY OF ARMY AND AIR NATIONAL GUARD TECHNICIANS

GENERAL

Army and Air National Guard Technicians are federally recognized officers, warrant officers, or enlisted men/airmen of the National Guard (Army/Air), employed as civilians for the performance of administrative, supply, accounting, operational, and maintenance functions in connection with the National Guard Program.

Authority for the Technicians Program emanates from Sac 90, National Defense Act, and technician's wages, and reimbursement for travel expenses, is supported entirely from Federal funds provided by Department of Defense Appropriations for the National Guard. The Adjutant Generals of the States and Territories are responsible to the National Guard Bureau for the effective administration of the National Guard Program within their respective States, and the Secretary of the Army and Air Force have delegated to the Adjutant Generals the authority to employ, fix rates of pay, establish duties and work hours, supervise and discharge, subject to the purview of appropriate regulations, laws, and instructions issued by the Chief of the National Guard Bureau. National Guard Technicians are thereby considered state employees.

The objective of the National Guard Technician Program is to

- (1) Provide a hard core of professionals within the National Guard, functioning full-time in their military occupational specialties, to assure the maintenance of a high standard of day-to-day operations and performances; and
- (2) Provide, upon mobilization, a nucleus of experienced and highly qualified specialists available for training and administering organizations and units.

IN EXCESS OF \$2,500,000.00 IN FEDERAL FUNDS IS BROUGHT INTO THE STATE OF IOWA EACH YEAR IN THE FORM OF WAGES AND TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD TECHNICIAN PROGRAM.

ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

PERSONNEL

To comply with the requirement that Army National Guard 1958 fiscal year-end strength not exceed 400,000, it became necessary during the year to establish State strength ceilings.

The federally recognized strength of the Iowa Army National Guard on 30 June 1958 was 7,123 officers, warrant officers and enlisted men. This strength was distributed among 85 federally recognized units. It represented a net loss of 558 for the fiscal year ending 30 June 1958, and brought the strength aggregate total within the ceiling established for the State.

The procurement of nonprior service personnel during fiscal year ending 30 June 1957 was affected by two major changes in policy. During the period 1 July 1956 through 30 September 1956 enlistments were accepted from individuals who met the moral, mental, physical, and age requirements prescribed in current National Guard Regulations. Effective 1 October 1956, twenty per cent of all individuals enlisting in the Army National Guard were required either to have had prior Federal service or to agree to take six months training with the active Army. On and after 1 April 1957, agreement to take a minimum of 11 weeks of active duty for training was made a condition of enlistment for men who had had no prior military service, with the exception of men between the ages of 26 and 35 who possess scarce military skills. At the same time it was announced that agreement to take a minimum of six months of active duty training would be a requirement for men enlisting in the Army National Guard after 1 October 1957 who had had no prior military service, with the exception stated above.

The standards for officer procurement were raised during the biennium. Effective 1 September 1957, the source criteria for second lieutenants were revised and additional active duty for training requirements were imposed. Effective 1 April 1958, qualifications for appointment of second lieutenants solely through completion of Army PreCommission Extension Courses was suspended. The Iowa Military Academy, State operated officer candidate school, commenced 1 July 1957, and thereafter candidate for commission in the Iowa Army National Guard were required to be graduates of either the Iowa Military Academy or a Branch Officer Candidate Course operated by the Active Army.

ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

TRAINING

Army National Guard training was conducted by the State in accordance with criteria established by Headquarters, United States Continental Army Command. On 1 May 1957 that Headquarters published a new training memorandum (number 9) pertaining to the training of Army National Guard nonprior service enlisted personnel. The objective set by this memorandum was to bring all such personnel to the maximum training level practicable in order that basic unit training might be initiated by 1 October 1958. To attain this objective, all Army National Guard units were required to limit the number of concurrent training programs to basic combat and advanced individual training. On 25 November 1957, Headquarters, United States Continental Army Command published training memorandum Number 19. The objective set by this memorandum was to insure that all Army National Guard personnel were prepared for integration into units required for mobilization to bring all nonprior active service personnel to a maximum practicable training level so that basic unit training might be initiated by 1 October 1958; and to train each unit

to a required degree of proficiency, starting with the squad or comparable unit and progressing to larger units.

All units of the Army National Guard participated in 48 paid training assemblies during fiscal year 1957 and 1958. During fiscal year 1957 eleven percent of the total authorized drills were conducted as multiple drills (two paid 4-hour assemblies conducted on one calendar day as a substitute for two regular 2-hour armory drill assemblies), and during fiscal year 1958 were conducted as multiple drills. Many units used multiple drills to increase the limited number of training hours otherwise available, with the result that the number of such drills conducted in fiscal year 1958 showed a 50% increase over the number conducted during fiscal year 1957.

Funds for subsistence were authorized to support multiple drill training assemblies. These funds were budgeted for on the basis of 52 cents per trainee for one meal or \$1.04 per trainee per day when more than one meal was required.

During fiscal year 1957 94.4% of officers and warrant officers and 87.6% of enlisted men participated in armory drills, and in fiscal year 1958 95.1% of officers and warrant officers and 87.9% of enlisted men participated.

Annual general inspections are conducted for the Army commander by officers detailed as inspectors general for the purpose of ascertaining whether equipment issued to the National Guard is being maintained as prescribed, proper quantities of equipment are on hand, units are properly organized, officers and enlisted personnel are qualified, records are properly maintained, and training is conducted as prescribed. During fiscal 1957 and 1958 over 99% of units were rated as satisfactory or better.

During fiscal years 1957 and 1958 Army National Guard units attended annual active duty for training. This annual 15-day training provides an opportunity for all federally recognized Army National Guard units to assemble and perform basic combat and advanced individual training as prescribed in appropriate Army training programs. During annual active duty training periods, teams composed of officers of the active Army inspected the training and reports of these inspections are used for evaluation purposes and as a basis for corrective action.

IOWA MILITARY ACADEMY

On 1 March 1957, General Order Number 6, published by the Adjutant General of Iowa, gave official status to the Iowa Military Academy (State OCS). This Order was the result of an OCS Conference held at Indianapolis, Indiana, 17-18 January 1957.

The Iowa Military Academy was the seventh Officer Candidate School established in the nation to provide Second Lieutenants for the National Guard.

The program of instruction is especially prepared by the U. S. Army Infantry School at Fort Benning, Georgia, and consists of some two hundred and fifty (250) hours of formal instruction in basic and special subjects, designed to qualify a candidate for commission in the Iowa National Guard.

In addition to the academic phase, the individual candidate receives training in practical leadership and command, concurrently throughout the course of instruction.

The program is designed so that the candidate attends one (1) training session a month for eight (8) months at Camp Dodge, Iowa, plus four (4) weeks of field training at Camp Dodge, Iowa. Approximately one year is required to complete the prescribed course of instruction.

Candidates are selected for the course on the basis of screening at unit and battle group and battalion level. In addition, personnel so selected must possess above average physical and mental qualities that are essential to an Officer Candidate course.

The Adjutant General of Iowa appointed Brigadier General Gerald E. DuBois, 34th Division Artillery Commander as the Commandant of the Iowa Military Academy with Major Eric P. Berner appointed as Assistant Commandant. Brigadier General DuBois died in March 1958 and Brigadier General Frank P. Williams, Deputy Commander, 34th Infantry Division was appointed.

Upon completion of the course, and a vacancy exists in his unit, the graduate is commissioned a Second Lieutenant. To date 90 officers of all branches have been graduated from the Academy.

Awards presented yearly to the honor graduates consist of a "Presentation Sabre" for Leadership Achievement. "Presentation Sabre" for Academic Achievement and a "watch" for the outstanding Cadet as selected by the Cadet Corps. The awards are donated by Major General Fred C. Tandy—"Watch", Major General Walter L. Anderson—"Sabre" and Brigadier General Carlton K. Smith—"Sabre".

LOGISTICS

During fiscal years 1957 and 1958 the National Guard Bureau continued to obtain new type equipment in most categories for use in training of Army National Guard units. Except for certain items, which were in short supply nationally and could not be made available, all annual active duty training requirements were adequately met. Particular emphasis was placed on the reduction of shortages of essential training equipment.

FINANCIAL INVENTORY ACCOUNTING, initiated in February of 1957, was fully accomplished by 1 November 1957. This had a major impact on supply management as evidenced by elimination of approximately 45% of the active stock records in the accounts of the United States Property and Fiscal Officer, and accelerated disposition of excess Federal property possessed by the Army National Guard. For the first time it was possible to ascertain the dollar value of Federal property in warehouses as well as in actual use. Programmed support within funds made available to the State was realistic and resulted in a higher percentage of obligations than in previous years. A complete revision of prescribed operating procedures, based upon evaluated tests in several States, resulted in a simplification of those procedures. The workload imposed by financial inventory accounting was absorbed within the established technician program.

EXCESS PROPERTY: Increased emphasis in the area of inventory and general supply management, through the application of financial inventory accounting at the State level, resulted in a reduction in both operating allowances and total dollar value of federally owned property in use by the Army National Guard through return of excess property to the active Army system and redistribution among States to meet Army National Guard operating requirements.

MAINTENANCE: Continued progress has been made in the operation and maintenance of equipment. The continuous maintenance program, together with additional maintenance facilities, has resulted in improved inspection ratings. Organizational maintenance has continued to improve as a result of intensive training in the use, operation and maintenance of organizational maintenance shops and administrative storage compounds. The workload in the combined field maintenance shops continued to increase due to the large quantity of equipment received, the exchange of obsolete items for modern equipment, and the modification of on-hand items of equipment.

ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

The Army National Guard Technician Program includes the following three categories of employees:

National Guard Operating Forces (Troop Units) (162)

Staff assistant officers, administrative specialists, administrative supply technicians, and organizational maintenance technicians employed as assistants to organizational and unit commanders in connection with administrative, supply and maintenance duties for which the commanders are responsible. These technicians are dispersed throughout the State wherever organizational headquarters or units are located.

United States Property and Fiscal Officer Technicians (46)

Accounting, clerical, warehousing and distribution technicians employed in the offices and warehouses of the United States Property and Fiscal Officer, located at Camp Dodge, Iowa, for duties in connection with supply and warehousing, distribution, budget and fiscal operations, transportation, purchasing and contracting, administration and maintenance, and all other related logistical support functions in connection with the Iowa National Guard Program in Iowa.

Field Maintenance Technicians (56)

Clerical and maintenance technicians employed in the Office of the State Maintenance Officer, the Combined Field Maintenance Shops and Concentration of Equipment Site, located at Camp Dodge, and the Army Aviation Maintenance Shops, located at Boone, for functions and duties in connection with repair and maintenance of equipment of Federal equipment issued to the Iowa National Guard. These technicians include supervisors, shop foremen, small arms and artillery mechanics, electronics repairmen, machinists, automotive mechanics, welders, painters, and helicopter and fixed wing aircraft mechanics.

132d Air Defense Wing, Iowa Air National Guard, 1 July 1956 to 30 June 1958

INTRODUCTION

At the start of this reporting period the 132d Fighter Interceptor Wing continued as a Wing-Base type organization which included the 173rd Fighter Interceptor Squadron, Lincoln, Neb., and the 174th Fighter Interceptor Squadron, Sioux City, Iowa, besides the Des Moines units. Both units outside of Des Moines were augmented with services and maintenance support personnel. The Mobilization Day assignment was with the Air Defense Command.

MISSION

Throughout the entire reporting period the mission of this wing remained the same, i. e., as a part of the Reserve of the Air Force—To achieve and maintain that level of operational effectiveness to be capable of intercepting and destroying enemy airborne weapons; As a part of the Iowa National Guard, the mission is that of protecting life and property in the preservation of peace, order and public safety when under competent orders of state authority.

ORGANIZATION

The Des Moines ANG Base was a part of the Air Defense net of the United States during the period 1 July 1956 to 30 June 1958. The 124th Fighter Interceptor Squadron maintained two (2) aircraft on five (5) minute readiness during daylight hours under the operational control of the 20th Air Division, Grandview Air Force Base, Missouri.

On 1 October 1956, the 132d Motor Vehicle Squadron was designated the 132d Transportation Squadron per General Order number 29, AG Iowa, 1956.

On 5 March 1958 the Wing structure was changed by the elimination of the 174th Fighter Interceptor Squadron as a part of the wing. Assigned at this time were the 114th Fighter Group, Sioux Falls, S. D., and the 173rd Fighter Interceptor Squadron, Lincoln, Nebraska.

In accordance with General Order #16, AG Iowa, 7 April 1958, the wing was again reorganized into the following units. Each group was a self sustaining base operation with the Wing Headquarters as a command and staff function.

AWARDS, DECORATIONS AND COMMENDATIONS

The Gunnery Team of the 132d Fighter Interceptor Wing, including pilots and personnel from all three bases, as the representative of the Air National Guard of the United States placed fourth in the All-Air Force Air Weapons Meet at Nellis Air Force Base, Nevada, in October 1956.

Major Bruce G. Johnston, Intelligence Officer, 132d Ftr Intcp Wg, placed second in the Fifth Army Area Individual Indoor Rifle Match and was awarded the Chief, NGB Bronze Metal.

The 132d Transportation Squadron was awarded the Governor Leo A. Hoegh Air Trophy in 1956 for highest attendance at Field Training Exercises.

1st Lt Samuel P. Bonson, 132d Fighter Group was awarded the Commendation Ribbon by the Fifth Air Force for rescue work in Japan in 1954. The award was presented on 14 October, 1956.

The 132d Supply Squadron was awarded the Wing Support Squadron Trophy as the outstanding support squadron in 1956.

1st Lt Charles P. Garrison, 124th Fighter Squadron, was presented the Distinguished Flying Cross on 6 October 1956 for outstanding performance of flying duties while stationed in Japan during 1954.

The USAF Flying Safety Award for the outstanding Squadron in the Air National Guard for the period of July through December 1956 was awarded to the 124th Fighter Interceptor Squadron.

The two Iowa ANG tactical squadrons, 124th of Des Moines and the 174th of Sioux City, received plaques for placing second and third respectively in Spaatz Trophy competition during calendar year 1956.

The Tenth Air Force Flying Safety Plaque was awarded to the 132d Fighter Interceptor Wing as the outstanding wing in the Tenth Air Force area. This was in recognition of a perfect flying safety record during the six months period ending 31 December 1956.

Major General Winston P. Wilson, Chief, Air Division, National Guard Bureau, forwarded a letter of commendation to the officers, airmen and air technicians Detachment associated with the 124th Fighter Interceptor Squadron for the outstanding services rendered to the Air Defense network of the United States as members of the runway alert augmentation from 1 July 1956 to 30 June 1958.

AIR TECHNICIAN DETACHMENT

The Air National Guard is operated on a day-to-day basis by an Air Technician Detachment. The personnel of these detachments are required to maintain the aircraft, train the 'drill status' pilots, maintain vehicles, facilities and security, obtain and store equipment and supplies, perform various administrative functions including reports required by higher headquarters and military and civilian pay. All air technicians are assigned to comparable military positions within this wing.

INSTALLATIONS FACILITIES

The Base Facilities Section was authorized a full time Installations Facilities Supervisor during this period. Major Robert Chrisjohn was selected for this full time Officer position and held this position until 1 October 1957 when he was re-assigned as the Base Maintenance Officer and was replaced by Lt Col Robert L. Shetterly.

Several projects were initiated and completed during this period to provide the necessary facilities for the F86L Interceptor. The Back Aircraft Parking Apron was extended which nearly doubled the available parking space for the new aircraft. A Flight Simulator Building was built to house the simulator for the transition and proficiency of the pilots and a Rocket Storage Building was constructed to shelter and store the necessary rockets required for the F86L.

Installation of a lowered acoustic ceiling throughout the Operations and Lobby Area greatly improved the appearance and usability of this area. Several hundred feet of curbing was installed around the Vehicle Parking Areas and Roadways and the Hangar doors received a major overhaul job to put them back in serviceable condition.

In addition to the projects initiated and completed during this period considerable effort was expended on projects that were actually completed

during the following biennial period. Captain Earl M. Koele was transferred to the Installations position on 1 June 1958 on the reassignment of Col. Shetterly to active duty.

AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE

At the start of the biennial period 1 July 1956 to 30 June 1958 this maintenance activity was equipped with twenty-two (22) F-80C aircraft which was powered by the J-33 Allison engine and was armed with six (6) .50 caliber machine guns, and used the K-14 computing gun sight.

In addition to the assigned F-80C's, six (6) F-84E's were assigned for use by the Gunnery Team for participation in the world wide gunnery meet. The F-84E was equipped with the General Electric J-35 engine and the MA-2 Fire Control system, which consisted of the A-1 computing sight and the APG-30 "A" scan radar for range computation. The armament for the F-84E was six (6) .50 caliber machine guns.

In September 1956 full conversion from F-80C to F-84E aircraft was started and by January 1957 the maintenance section was equipped with six (6) F-80C's and eighteen (18) F-84E's. By 1 August 1957 all of the F-80C's had been transferred and twenty (20) F-84E's were on hand.

In April 1958 the maintenance activity was re-organized from the two (2) squadron (Fighter Squadron and Maintenance Squadron) type maintenance organization to the one (1) squadron concept titled Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron and at the same time conversion to the all weather Fighter Interceptor F-86L aircraft was started.

By the end of June 1958 eight (8) F-86L's were assigned and sixteen (16) F-84E's were still on hand. The F-86L is a supersonic fighter Interceptor powered by the General Electric J-47 engine and afterburner. The weapons system consists of the E-4 Radar "A" and "B" scan fire control system which automatically fires the twenty-four (24) 2:75" FAAR rockets.

During the entire period of this report five (5) support aircraft were assigned; three (3) T-33A Jet Trainers, one (1) C-47A and one (1) C-45H.

The average operational readiness rate for aircraft assigned during the biennial period 1 July 1956 to 30 June 1958 was as follows:

AIRCREW OPERATIONAL READINESS

During the period 1 July 1956 to 30 June 1958 the 124th Fighter Interceptor Squadron completed two (2) aircraft conversions. The conversion from F-80C fighter/bomber aircraft to F-84E day fighter aircraft was completed by 30 June 1957. All tactical aircrews assigned to the 124th FIS qualified in air-to-air gunnery in the F-84E at Casper, Wyoming, during Field Training in July 1957. A high state of aircrew operational readiness was maintained in the F-84E by active participation in the runway alert program and several gunnery exercises.

In April 1958 the 124th FIS received its first F-86L all-weather interceptors. Pilot transition was started immediately into the new radar

equipped aircraft. A new F-86 simulator building was completed in time to provide important pilot training prior to checkout in the F-86L aircraft. The unit received two (2) Flying Safety Awards during the period from 1 July 1956 to 30 June 1958.

Biennial Report for Supply, 1 July 56 to 30 June 58

1. Problems and accomplishments:

- a. During this period a conversion from F-80 to F-84 type aircraft was accomplished. A conversion from F-84 to F-86L aircraft was started during the last quarter of FY 58.
- b. Publications Distribution was added to Base Supply in the 1st part of 1957 as an additional duty.
- c. To gain necessary storage space for JP-4 fuel, an into-plane contract for 100/130 octane fuel was initiated by the Air Force. This improved our fuel service operation.
- d. During the last quarter of FY 58 the Unit Supply procedures were radically changed by the National Guard Bureau. Formal property records on items with a unit cost of \$9.99 or below were dropped. All property stored in Unit Supply and not in use was to be turned into Base Supply for storage. The six (6) individual unit supply accounts were consolidated into one account with three (3) Technicians instead of six (6) as before.
- e. The imprest fund system for small purchases was initiated in February 58 and greatly reduced the time required to procure and issue small local purchase items.
- f. A reclassification of warehouse technicians to NGW from NGC positions was accomplished in 1958.









FLIGHT SIMULATOR BUILDING, DES MOINES ANG BASE 1957




ROCKET STORAGE BUILDING, DES MOINES ANG BASE 1957

INTRODUCTION

The 133d AC&W Flight, Iowa Air National Guard, with Headquarters at Fort Dodge, Iowa, and a detachment "A" at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is part of the 157th Tactical Control Group of St. Louis, Missouri. Units of the Group are made up of Flights and Squadrons from Iowa, Wisconsin, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, Alabama, and Missouri. The mobilization assignment is to the Tactical Air Command.

MISSION

The mission of the 133d Aircraft Control and Warning Flight is to achieve and maintain a level of operational effectiveness which will enable the unit to gather information on air activity, within a designated air space, presenting this information accurately and timely to control personnel who will use information gathered in the effective employment of assigned defensive or offensive means. To install, operate, and maintain authorized communication and electronic facilities necessary to carry out the unit

mission. To provide administrative and housekeeping facilities for unit personnel. To maintain an independent element in the aircraft control and warning system capable of sustained and effective operation under combat conditions.

PERSONNEL

On 1 July 1956 the unit was composed of seventeen (17) officers and one hundred eighty-eight (188) airmen. Since the unit was not at full strength emphasis was still placed on recruiting. By 31 January 1957 the strength increased to 18 officers and 224 airmen and by 30 June 1958 the strength had grown to 25 officers and 263 airmen.

TRAINING

The unit had seventy seven (77) officers and airmen who attended service school during this period. In October 1957 a policy was put into effect that all non prior service men joining our unit were required to go to an Air Force Technical School in addition to the mandatory requirement of basic training.

TESTING

During this period, 124 airmen were tested of which 85% qualified for advancement.

MATERIAL

Supply:

The unit was satelliated on the Air National Guard Base Supply at Sioux City. Fiscal year 1957 was the first complete year under this operation which proved to be very satisfactory and successful.

Communications and Electronics:

In September 1957 the unit received an AN/MPS-11 radar set which was the latest in mobile tactical radar equipment. This set was far superior to the previous sets possessed by the unit. This provided more realistic operations and training. AN/TRC-35 FM radio sets were received in the later part of 1956. During the spring months of 1958, relay sites were set up between Fort Dodge and Cedar Rapids during the week end UTA's.

OPERATIONS

The unit had a control and reporting center at Fort Dodge, Iowa and a Control and Reporting Post at Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Both locations had radar and radio equipment. During week end UTA's, weather and flying hours permitting, the unit Controlled and ran intercepts with planes furnished by the 132nd Fighter Interceptor Wing, Iowa ANG, Des Moines, Iowa. Hot lines were provided during week end UTA's starting in late 1957, between the 128th AC&W Squadron, Milwaukee, Wisconsin and 157th Tac Control Group at St. Louis, Missouri. This allowed the unit to work in an overall tactical Control System during UTA's in addition to Field Training.

INSTALLATIONS

The unit was co-located with the Army National Guard in the Fort Dodge Armory. One end of the Armory being modified for the C-E equipment. This proved most inadequate and in July 58 the NGB approved and provided funds for a separate Armory designed to fit the needs of this AC&W Unit. Contract for the new armory was let in June 1958.

The disbursements for the year ended June 30, 1957 was \$330,919.18 greater than the previous year. This increase is due, in the greater portion, to the Capital Appropriation Fund, which is an expansion program fund. This same fund was appropriated during the previous fiscal year; therefore, is the account responsible for the decrease in the receipts for this audit period.

The receipts of the Armory Allowance Account are for temporary armory space rentals, "cost reimbursable" by the Federal Government on service contracts and various types of small refunds within the various armories over the State.

The receipts in the Camp Dodge Maintenance account are for heat, light and water furnished residents in Camp Dodge and surrounding State owned property. Deposits of said receipts with the Treasurer of State were verified.

The Armory Allowance account, Schedule "C-7," shows a breakdown by type of expenditure for each Armory and Airport. The total expenditures increased only 1½ per cent, while the receipts to this account increased approximately 92 per cent.

The Camp Dodge Maintenance account, Schedule "C-9," shows a breakdown by type of expenditure, also an increase of approximately 17 per cent in expenditures compared to an increase in receipts of 14.5 per cent.

The Headquarters Allowance account, fixed by the State Armory Board for each National Guard Unit, and the Per Capita Allowance account, based on the average enlisted strength of each National Guard Unit during each semi-annual period, are shown in Schedule "C-8." The total of these two accounts increased \$7,473.60, of this amount \$7,036.10 was the amount of increase within the Per Capita Account. In accordance to basis of the allowance the increase therefore shows the enlisted strength of all units to be 19 per cent greater.

EXHIBIT "D" AND "E" — COMPENSATION — DEATH AND INJURY — COMPENSATION — PROPERTY DAMAGE

These two accounts are classified as "Overdraft Appropriation Accounts" i.e., there is no estimate made or monies "ear-marked," but an appropriation at the end of the period to cover all payments made which were registered as overdrafts. The property damage account increased \$474.14 making it three times greater than the previous year. These damages were due to accidents involving military vehicles paid per chapter 29.56, Code of Iowa 1954.

EXHIBIT "F" — AID TO CIVIL AUTHORITY

This account is also known as an "Overdraft" appropriation account. The net disbursements for the year ended June 30, 1958 increased \$63,354.78 which is over three times as great. The Salaries-State Guard is the expense account responsible for this increase, which is shown in the following summary:

The 56th General Assembly appropriated this fund to be used for lockers, folding chairs, and fire extinguishers for Armories throughout the State and to make various repairs at Camp Dodge. The balance at June 30, 1957 being only \$240.55.

EXHIBIT "J" — CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS 2-A

The 56th General Assembly made this fund available for the State's share of the Armory construction program in conjunction with the Federal Government. This program consists of acquisition, construction, expansion, rehabilitation and conversion of facilities for the administration and training of units of the National and State Guard. The balance of this fund on June 30, 1957 was \$78,060.86.

It is noted that of the construction projects in existence June 30, 1957 only \$850.00 remains unpaid. It will also be noted that the rental cost for the subsequent year will be less, due to the completed armory construction projects during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1957.

EXHIBIT "A" SUMMARY OF ALL FUNDS

In comparing to the prior year there has been three new appropriated funds recognized and one fund was used in its entirety during the prior year. Due to these appropriations and other types of receipts being larger, there was considerable more balance at the year end June 30, 1958. The disbursements for the period were \$342,664.11 less than the prior year and accounted for in the following summary:

EXHIBIT "B" — SALARIES AND SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF ARMORIES

The decrease of \$115,037.79 is divided, with \$32,923.79 in Salaries and \$82,114.00 in Support and Maintenance subsidiary accounts. All of the State share of the retirement programs both State and Federal are included as a portion of the Salaries expense.

The following summary shows the increase or decrease by type of expense.

The foregoing summary is self-explanatory except for the account "armory allowance" which shows a decrease of \$55,617.73. Exhibit "B" Schedule "2" lists the type of expense involved in this account. The rent decreased \$31,099.26 due to the completed construction of armories in various sections of the State during the previous and current year. The account "Lease with Purchase Option" shows a decrease of \$38,625.23, which is the payment due and outstanding on June 30, 1958. The remaining expense accounts net an increase. This accounts for the total of the overall decrease.

The travel expense, as listed above, has several items which were paid through claims, from forty-four individuals attending a National Guard Convention at Louisville, Kentucky. We feel approval of these various claims do not conform with approved accounting practices and feel that a more efficient system of approving claims be established. Some of the reasons for the above statement are as follows:

1. Claims that do not itemize the daily expense, such as, a charge of \$25.00 per day for 5 days.
2. Double charges on a claim.
3. Charges for items paid by other sources of state funds.

We wish to call to your attention to Chapter 8.15, Code of Iowa 1958, which, reads in part,

"Vouchers. Before a warrant shall be issued for any claim payable from the State Treasury, there shall be filed an itemized, sworn voucher which shall show in detail the items of service, expense, thing furnished, or contract upon which payment is sought."

The Headquarters allowance account is a set amount, which is fixed by the State Armory Board of each National Guard Unit.

The Per Capita Allowance Account is based on the average enlisted strength of each National Guard Unit during each semi-annual period. This account decreased \$1,581.55 and therefore shows the enlisted strength of all units to be somewhat smaller during this period.

COMPENSATION — DEATH AND INJURY FUND COMPENSATION — PROPERTY DAMAGE

These two accounts are classified as "Over-Draft Appropriation Accounts" i.e., there is no estimate made or money "ear-marked," but an appropriation at the end of the period to cover all payments made which were registered as over-drafts. The Death and Injury Fund consisted of payments to one individual based on a private's pay plus daily subsistence allowance. Authority being Chapter 29.29, Code of Iowa 1954.

The Property Damage account are payments for damages due to accidents involving military vehicles. During the period under review this account increased \$902.66. The larger part of this increase was due to airplane accidents.

EXHIBIT "C"—COMPENSATION AND EXPENSE—ACTIVE STATE SERVICE

This account is also known as an "Over-draft Appropriation." However, in comparing to the past years it is noted that the total disbursements are once again in the \$30,000.00 bracket. This being a decrease from the preceding year and in the same bracket as the two year previous totals, shown as follows:

It was noted that not all claims were in order and again we wish to call your attention to Chapter 8.15 Code of Iowa 1958.

CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS

The 56th General Assembly appropriated this fund to be used for purchase of lockers, folding chairs and fire extinguishers for armories throughout the State and to make various repairs at Camp Dodge. The balance of \$240.55, July 1, 1957, was disbursed in its entirety and thereby closed the account.

EXHIBIT "D" — CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS

The 56th General Assembly made this fund available for the State's share of the Armory Construction program in conjunction with the Federal

Government. This program consists of acquisition, construction, expansion, rehabilitation and conversion of units of the National and State Guard. The receipts credited to this account were for sales and use tax refunds due on payment from the prior year construction contracts. As noted in the exhibit this was considered as an income in place of a reduction to disbursements. It is also noted the \$40,110.85 of the \$58,165.31 total disbursements was for construction of a Fairfield Armory, and in the prior year there was construction work on nine armories.

EXHIBIT "E AND F" — VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Chapter 16 (S. F. 474) 57th General Assembly appropriated from the General Fund of the State \$252,500.00 to be used in the following manner.

1-A—\$145,000.00 for the State's share of armory construction program made available to the State by the Federal government for acquisition, construction, expansion, rehabilitation and converting facilities for units of the National and State Guard. There were no disbursements from this account.

2-A—\$40,000.00 for repairs, replacements, alterations, equipment, and rehabilitation of armories in connection with which Federal Funds may be accepted. Exhibit "E" shows the various armories on which disbursements were made during this period. Attention is directed to the listing of "various armories-quantity purchases" in the amount of \$3,297.12. Within this disbursement \$1,727.18 was disbursed for the purchase of paint and \$1,410.00 for purchase of folding chairs. It is suggested, at the time the claim is presented for payment, that it specify for which armory or armories the various quantity purchases were made.

The balance of this fund on June 30, 1958 was \$14,086.89.

3-A—\$67,500.00 for repairs, replacement, alterations, equipment and rehabilitation of grounds, buildings and roads at Camp Dodge. Exhibit "F" gives the detail on the various type of expenditures within this fund during the period under review. During the month of October 1957, 850 gallons of gasoline was charged to this account. This being the only time gasoline was charged to this account makes us question the correctness of the charge and payment. To show further reason for questioning is that all other gasoline purchased was charged to the fund "Support and Maintenance of armories—Camp Dodge Maintenance No. 1-48-10-57."

CAMP DODGE IMPROVEMENT TRUST FUND

The receipts in the amount of \$24,172.21 are from rental of State owned property in and surrounding Camp Dodge, farm products income, temporary building rental to various organizations, sale and use of material and equipment, etc.

The disbursements total \$29,777.71 and are shown, by type, in the following summary:

EXHIBIT "H" — CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

The State's share of this construction program is 25 per cent of the total cost with the Federal Government paying 75 per cent. The total cost of all armories completed or under construction at June 30, 1958 was \$2,587,400.42.

GENERAL COMMENTS

There are approximately 60 armories located in various parts of the State, 13 are rented properties, 22 are leased with purchase option and 26 are State owned under the State-Federal Construction Program. With this information in mind it is suggested that a system of accounting be installed to separate the receipts and disbursements of each unit and of each fund.

The cash receipts for a fiscal year amount to approximately \$150,000.00, not including appropriations, which vary through special projects necessary in emergencies.

The disbursements for a fiscal year amount to approximately one million dollars which is not including expenses paid by the Federal Government. The point which is our desire to bring out is the magnitude of this department, the number of personnel involved, the amount of money passing through the funds and the large area included. It is therefore reason enough to recommend, under Chapter 11.4, Sec. 4 of the Code of Iowa 1954, the separation of each unit's receipts and disbursements by funds, with a control of all units by funds. This will then accumulate all information on each unit for greater simplicity, accuracy and efficiency.


