Northwest Iowa Flood Response

Volunteer lowa has been active in the response to the flooding in northwest lowa since late June. Twelve Volunteer Reception Centers (VRCs) have been established by local counties in flood-effected communities, with support from Volunteer Iowa. Over 1000 volunteers have come through these VRCs to support the cleanup efforts.

AmeriCorps members serving in lowa have mobilized to the flood impacted counties to support the response effort. AmeriCorps programs in Iowa who have sent members to the flood affected areas are Habitat for Humanity of Iowa Mobile Response team, RIVA AmeriCorps and the Iowa Community Corps. Volunteer lowa staff also assisted with volunteer recruitment and management at five Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) application locations in northwest Iowa.


