
Volunteer Iowa VISTA Program Update

August 8th the Volunteer Iowa team joined by Jancy Lafollette with AmeriCorps Headquarters, Kristin Honz and Meghann Henry with the AmeriCorps North Central Regional Office participated in a site visit in Neola, IA. The visit was to learn about the VISTAs serving with NAMI Southwest Iowa and how their service has impacted the organization and community. The work the VISTAs are doing have increased the organization's ability to bring more people together to support mental health, develop programming and expand to new areas in southwest lowa. A week later, on August 14, VISTA members, leaders, and supervisors gathered at Blank Park Zoo in Des

Moines for a day full of training and activities. VISTA leaders facilitated a panel discussion with three AmeriCorps alums: Anna Nalen served two terms with Campus Compact MN/IA and as a VISTA Leader with Iowa Council of Foundations; Donya Jenkins-Gai served with Volunteer Iowa as a VISTA Leader; and Daniel Warfel, VISTA member with Volunteer lowa. The big takeaway is that no matter how small your work may feel you are making a big difference. Two others joined us to discuss poverty in Iowa: Kelli Soyer, United Ways of Iowa provided a glimpse into

the challenges individuals and families considered ALICE (Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed). This was an overview of what the poverty in Iowa is like. Sarah Trone Garriott of DMARC led the VISTA team in a Hunger Simulation. During the presentation she gave us insight into her personal background story of her VISTA term of service, working in food pantries, and how she is championing food insecurities in Iowa.
