


Iowa EdTech Update - First of the Year!

Apply Now for Career Academy Incentive Fund

The <u>Career Academy Incentive Fund</u> offers specialized grants aimed at fostering collaborations between school districts and community colleges to enhance access to career academy programs, particularly those offered through regional centers. Each year, the Iowa Department of Education allocates up to \$5 million in grants for projects that align with the established criteria. The total number of grants awarded depends on the available funding and the variety of applications submitted.

The Schools and Libraries Cybersecurity Pilot Program will provide up to \$200 million to selected participants over a three-year term to purchase a wide variety of cybersecurity services and equipment.

Modeled after the FCC's Connected Care Pilot, the Pilot Program will evaluate the effectiveness of using Universal Service funding to support cybersecurity services and equipment to protect school and library broadband networks and data in order to determine whether to fund them on a permanent basis...

Why Schools Need an Incident Response Recovery Plan Today

Incident response plans provide a critical blueprint for how schools can withstand a cybersecurity attack or natural disaster and maintain cyber resilience. However, a <u>2023</u> <u>CoSN survey</u> revealed that only 41 percent of K–12 schools had implemented an IR plan.

For many technology leaders, time can be a hindrance in forming a plan, explains Neal Richardson, technology director for the <u>Hillsboro-Deering School District</u>, in New Hampshire.

"The typical operations of school, day in and day out, don't leave a whole lot of time to actually sit down and focus on developing that response plan," says Richardson, who oversees cybersecurity and IT for the district's five buildings, which include four schools and an alternative learning program...
