

Investment analysis



For every \$1...

= 1,000 jobs * = family of four



Students gain \$5.40 in lifetime earnings



The average bachelor's degree graduate from the UI will see an increase in earnings of \$22,800 each year compared to someone with a high school diploma working in Iowa.



Taxpayers gain \$3.50 in added tax revenue and public sector savings





Society gains \$4.10 in added income and social savings
