

IOWA INFLUENZA (FLU) IMMMUNIZATION DATA

Influenza vaccination data includes the number of Iowa residents recorded in IRIS as having received at least one dose of influenza vaccine during the 2024-25 flu season (August 1, 2024 – May 31, 2025). Individuals 6 months and older are recommended to receive the flu vaccine each year.




2024-25 INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION COVERAGE COMPARED TO PREVIOUS YEARS

During the 2024-25 influenza season, 35.9% of Iowa residents received a flu vaccine. This is an increase compared to last season's rate of 33.8% but is comparable to the 2022-23 season. Coverage rates continues to remain well below the <u>Healthy People 2030</u> goal of 70% coverage.
