
WOMEN IN IOWA: 2008

In 1981, the U.S. Congress passed a resolution establishing National Women's History Week. The week was chosen to coincide with International Women's Day, March 8. In 1987, Congress expanded the week to a month. Every year since, Congress and the lowa General Assembly have passed a resolution for Women's History Month, and the U.S. president and lowa's Governor have issued a proclamation.

The estimated population of females in Iowa as of July 1, 2006. That exceeds the number of men (1,472,810). Males outnumber females in every five-year-age group through the 50-to-54 age group. Starting with the 55-to-59 age group women outnumber men. At ages 85 and over there are more than twice as many women as men.

The projected female population of Iowa as of July 1, 2030. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, women will constitute 50.4 percent of the states's total population on that date.






The percent of women in lowa in management, professional, and related occupations in 2006. This is the largest occupation group for women in the state.


