We'll be doing a variety of things such as encouraging people to return their questionnaires, displaying/distributing 2010 Census promotional materials, placing articles in the E-news, adding 2010 Census Website link onto our website, and consultants are available to help fill out the questionnaires by appointment.

#### 2010 Census Timeline: Key Dates Spring 2009:

Census employees go door-to-door to update address list nationwide.

#### Fall 2009:

Recruitment begins for census takers needed to peak workload in 2010.

#### February—March 2010

Census questionnaires are mailed or delivered to households.

### April 1, 2010

Census Day

### April—July 2010

Census takers visit households that did not return a questionnaire by mail.

### December 2010

By law, Census Bureau delivers population counts to President for apportionment.

### March 2011

1

By law, Census Bureau completes delivery of redistricting data to states.

The Hearing Aid Tax Credit bill, (H.R. 1646) is now before the United States Congress. The National Hearing Loss Association, and our local HLA-CI are advocates. A brief description follows: "The Hearing Aid Tax Credit would provide assistance to many of the 31.5 million people who need hearing aids to treat their hearing loss.
