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Auditor of State David A. Vaudt today released a report on the Iowa Veterans Home and the Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs for the year ended June 30, 2008.

The Iowa Commission of Veterans Affairs, which consists of nine members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate, oversees the conduct and operations of the Iowa Veterans Home and the Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs.

The Iowa Veterans Home, located in Marshalltown, Iowa, provides long-term health care for Iowa's aging, chronically ill, handicapped veterans and their dependent or surviving spouses. The annualized cost per resident was \$104,797 in fiscal year 2008, a 10.2% increase over the prior year. The average number of residents increased from 708 in fiscal year 2007 to 715 in fiscal year 2008.

The Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs, located at Camp Dodge in Johnston, Iowa, administers the War Orphans Educational Fund, maintains military service records of Iowa veterans and provides assistance to and training for county veterans affairs commissions.
