
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GOVERNMENT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Committee Meetings

January 27 Meeting



The Government Oversight Committee met on January 27 and 28 and conducted the following business:

The Committee discussed contracting for information technology utilizing State master contracts, sole source contracts, and how local governments use these State contracts. The following information was presented:

- Department of Administrative Services Director Mollie Anderson discussed the number of contracts the Department is responsible for and summarized the processes used to enter into contracts. The Department does not have an adequate tracking system for the number of contracts maintained. The Integrated Information for Iowa (I/3) System will have the ability to store contract data for all State departments.
- Local Government Susan Judkins, Iowa League of Cities; and John Easter, Iowa State Association of Counties (ISAC); told the Committee that League and ISAC members purchase from the State using master contracts. The Committee requested additional information regarding local governments using master contracts.
- Information Technology Industry Representative Miriam Ubben, representing 240 lowa Information Technology businesses, expressed concerns about the process used for State contracts. The concerns are related to the renewal process of current contracts, and that lowa businesses should be allowed to bid on the contracts prior to extension to ensure State funds remain in lowa.

January 28 Meeting

The Committee discussed HSB 533 and SSB 3005 (Submission of Lottery Authority Budget to the Legislature Bill). These companion Bills were voted out of the Government Oversight Committee.

Future Meetings

Agenda topics for future meetings include:

- February 3 Agricultural land values, property tax valuations, agricultural productivity formulas, and property tax credits.
- February 10 Discussion with the Department of Human Services and interested parties regarding the recent Request for Proposals (RFPs) for the Medical Assistance (Medicaid) Program administrative services for FY 2005.

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MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM ESTIMATES FOR FY 2004 AND FY 2005

Medicaid Estimates



Staff members from the Department of Management, the Department of Human Services, and the Fiscal Services Division of the LSA met on January 23 to discuss estimated enrollment and expenditures in the Medical Assistance (Medicaid) Program for FY 2004 and FY 2005. The three staffs meet monthly to agree on an estimated range for Medicaid expenditures compared to the appropriation.

FY 2004 Estimate

The group agreed to an estimated range of a surplus of \$0.0 to \$15.0 million when compared to the FY 2004 estimated net appropriation. The need for a supplemental appropriation for Medicaid in FY 2004 does not appear likely at this time. The estimate takes into account the increased federal matching rate due to the federal fiscal relief package.

FY 2005 Estimate

The group also agreed on an estimated range for FY 2005. The estimated need for FY 2005 is an increase of \$53.9 million to \$82.0 million compared to the FY 2004 estimated net appropriation. The estimated net FY 2004 amount reflects a decrease of \$16.2 million from the original appropriation due to the \$15.2 million transfer from Medicaid to the Salary Adjustment Fund and the \$1.0 million Charter Agency reduction.

Governor's Recommendation The Governor is recommending an increase of \$53.9 million from various State funds for Medicaid for FY 2005. This includes:



- An increase of \$57.9 million from the General Fund.
- A decrease of \$10.0 million from the Senior Living Trust Fund.
- An increase of \$6.0 million from the Hospital Trust Fund.
